Along with the Great Andamanese, the Jarawas, the Onge, the Shompen, and the Nicobarese, the Sentinelese make up one of the six indigenous (and often reclusive) peoples of the Andaman and Nicobar Islands. The tribe has had minimal contact with outsiders and has usually been hostile to those who approach or land on the island. In preparation, he participated in missionary trips to Mexico, Israel, Iraq, and the Andaman Islands. He also underwent "boot camp"-style training conducted by the evangelical organization All Nations, which included mock scenarios coordinated by missionary staff who pretended to be hostile tribespeople. Before departing, Chau was vaccinated and quarantined, and brought with him a survival kit including picture cards and gifts for the Sentinelese. Upon arriving, Chau attempted to land on the island three times to no success. During his final attempt, he was fatally struck by an arrow of the Sentinelese, who buried his body on the shore. aa23f0be99

Dāūwacho-chégálé-bāī reportedly resided in a village on North Sentinel Island named Tame-Ebui. In the late 19th century, he left North Sentinel Island in a wooden canoe, and drifted away by accident, likely after a tropical storm pushed his boat beyond the shallow coastal reefs and into the open waters of the Bay of Bengal, where traditional punting poles couldn't be used to get back to the island. aa23f0be99 It is presumed that the islanders speak a single language and that it is a member of one of the Andamanese language families. Based on what little is known about similarities in culture and technology and their geographical proximity, it is supposed that their language is related to the Ongan languages, such as Jarawa, rather than to Great Andamanese. On the documented occasions when Onge-speaking individuals were taken to North Sentinel Island to attempt communication, they were unable to recognise any of the language spoken by the inhabitants. Maurice Vidal Portman, a British naval officer who visited North Sentinel Island, recorded that one of his Onge companions—an individual named Tomiti—claimed that the Sentinelese spoke an entirely different language unintelligible to him. From the limited information available it can be said that South Sentinel Island is a forested coral reef. From a journal written in the 19th century, a Colonel Alcock who passed the island wrote "[South Sentinel is] raised a few feet and continuous with the corals surrounding it". Nominally, the island belongs to the South Andaman administrative district, part of the Indian union territory of Andaman and Nicobar Islands. In practice, Indian authorities recognise the islanders' desire to be left alone, restricting outsiders to remote monitoring (by boat and sometimes air) from a reasonably safe distance; the Government of India will not prosecute the Sentinelese for killing people in the event that an outsider ventures ashore. In 2018, the Government of India excluded 29 islands—including North Sentinel—from the Restricted Area Permit (RAP) regime... The island lies 186 km (100+1¼ nmi) southwest of Port Blair.
