Social determinants of mental health Interventions can be implemented to address the social determinants of mental health, environmentally, structurally, and locally to help improve mental health outcomes and reduce the rate of mental illnesses. Much like the social determinants of health (SDOH), SDO MH include the non-medical factors that play a role in the likelihood and severity of health outcomes, such as income levels, education attainment, access to housing, and social inclusion. Disparities in mental health outcomes are a result of a multitude of factors and social determinants, including fixed characteristics on an individual level – such as age, gender, race/ethnicity, and sexual orientation – and environmental factors that stem from social and economic inequalities – such as inadequate access to proper food, housing, and transportation, and exposure to pollution.
