Jazz historian Dave Gelly described the promise of Baker's early career as "James Dean, Sinatra, and Bix, rolled into one". His well-publicized drug habit also drove his notoriety and fame. Carter and B.G. then formed the Southern hip-hop group Hot Boys with labelmates Juvenile and Turk in 1997, and released their debut album, *Get It How U Live!* that year. The Hot Boys gained mainstream success after the release of their second album *Guerrilla Warfare* (1999) and their appearance on B.G.'s single, "Bling Bling." The group briefly disbanded after the album due to each member (besides Carter) parting ways with the label, although...

b9471a22a2 He was caught helping Marie Mathews escape slavery and was acquitted. Soon after, he helped a young woman and two young men named Isaac and Alexander. He was arrested for enticing slaves to runaway in 1847. After 14 months in jail, he was found guilty. He was sentenced to ten months in jail and a \$500 fine, after which he was put on the auction block to be sold into slavery. Abolitionists found that he was about to be sold and Isaac Flint posed as a slave buyer and bought Burris; he then set him free. b9471a22a2

Chet Baker (December 23, 1929 – May 13, 1988) was an American jazz trumpeter and vocalist. By late 1968 or early 1969, he needed dentures. He is known for major innovations in cool jazz that led him to be nicknamed the "Prince of Cool". This ruined his embouchure, and he struggled to relearn how to Chesney Henry Baker Jr. to his teeth eventually deteriorating b9471a22a2

Brothers (Yu novel) It has over 180 thousand characters in Chinese, more than the 100 thousand characters that were originally planned for the book. It intertwines tragedy and comedy, and Yu Hua himself admits that the novel is personally his favorite literary work. Brothers was a new realm of literature for Yu Hua, with the novel often being described as extremely crude and expletive. Brothers has experienced great success with nearly 1 million copies sold in China. While reception among Chinese critics was generally negative, the novel was shortlisted for the Man Asian Literary Prize and awarded. By 2019, Yu Hua's works had been published in 38 countries and translated into 35 different languages.
