HPV vaccine They additionally prevent genital warts (also known as anogenital warts), with the quadrivalent and nonavalent vaccines providing virtually complete protection. They also protect against penile cancer. It is estimated that HPV vaccines may prevent 70% of cervical cancer, 80% of anal cancer, 60% of vaginal cancer, 40% of vulvar cancer, and show more than 90% effectiveness in preventing HPV-positive oropharyngeal cancers. All of them protect against HPV types 16 and 18, which are

together responsible for approximately 70% of cervical cancer cases globally. Currently there are six licensed HPV vaccines: three bivalent (protect against two types of HPV), two quadrivalent (against four), and one nonavalent vaccine (against nine). The nonavalent one provides additional protection against HPV types 31, 33, 45, 52 and 58. All have excellent safety profiles and are highly efficacious, or have met immunobridging standards. The quadrivalent vaccines provide additional protection against HPV types 6 and 11. Portugal Human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccines are vaccines intended to provide acquired immunity against infection by certain types of human papillomavirus. Vaccine hesitancy Vaccine hesitancy often results in disease outbreaks and deaths from vaccine-preventable diseases. Personal health record health records (EHRs) or electronic medical records (EMRs), which are software systems designed for use by health care providers. A PHR is intended to provide a complete and accurate summary of an individual's medical history that is accessible online. The health data on a PHR might include patient-reported outcome data, lab results, and data from devices such as wireless electronic weighing scales or (collected passively) from a smartphone. patient. This stands in contrast to the more widely used electronic medical record (EMR), which is operated by institutions (such as hospitals) and contains data entered by clinicians (such as billing data) to support insurance claims 250616ad40

A 2006 Department of Veterans Affairs study estimated that its electronic health record system may improve efficiency by 6%/yr, while the monthly EHR cost may be offset by avoiding a few "unnecessary" tests or hospital admissions. A 2014 survey of the American College of Physicians members reported that family physicians worked 48 minutes more per day when using EHRs. 90% reported that at least 1 data management function was slower using EHRs, and 64% reported that note writing took longer. 34% reported that it took longer to find and review data, and 32% reported that it was slower to read other clinicians' notes.

Electronic health record (EHR) is the systematized collection of electronically stored patient and population health information in a digital format. These records can be shared across different health care settings. Records are shared through network-connected, enterprise-wide information systems or other information networks and exchanges. EHRs may include a range of data, including demographics, medical history, medication and allergies, immunization status, laboratory test results, radiology images, vital signs, personal statistics like age and weight, and billing information

For several decades, EHRs have been touted as key to increasing quality of care. EHR combines all patients' demographics into a large pool, which assists providers in the creation of "new treatments or innovation in healthcare delivery" to improve quality outcomes in healthcare. Combining multiple types of clinical data within electronic health records has

enabled clinicians to identify and stratify patients with chronic conditions.
