Enamel hypoplasia (weak or thin enamel) has been found in the cases of hereditary... 1348666b82 The cause of cavities is acid from bacteria dissolving the hard tissues of the teeth (enamel, dentin, and cementum). The acid is produced by the bacteria when they break down food debris or sugar on the tooth surface. Simple sugars in food are these bacteria's primary energy source, and thus a diet high in simple sugar is a risk factor. If tooth demineralization is greater than tooth remineralization from sources such as saliva, caries results. Enamel hypocalcification Enamel hypocalcification is the inadequate deposition of inorganic ions, resulting in the appearance of translucency, white-chalky spots, and yellow-brown discoloration on the surface of the tooth associated with increased sensitivity and a higher risk of developing dental caries. Their life cycle, known as amelogenesis, is divided into six stages: morphogenic, organizing, formative, maturative, protective, and desmolytic. Ameloblasts are the cells that produce the enamel. Hence, defects in the maturation stage result in hypocalcification or hypomineralization. Enamel mineralization occurs during the maturation stage. content of the enamel, causing it to become porous and hypomineralized, which can result in white or brown spots on the teeth 1348666b82

Completely unerupted wisdom teeth usually result in no symptoms, although they can sometimes develop cysts or neoplasms. However, in recent decades the preventive removal of impacted wisdom teeth has come into question, and some health organizations have issued guidelines calling to only remove impacted wisdom teeth in the case of. Removal of impacted wisdom teeth is advised for the future prevention of or in the current presence of certain pathologies, such as caries (dental decay), periodontal disease or cysts. Prophylactic (preventative) extraction of wisdom teeth is preferred to be done at a younger age (middle to late

teenage years) to take advantage of incomplete root development, which is associated with an easier surgical procedure and less probability of complications 1348666b82

The mouth is the beginning of the digestive system and a substantial part of the respiratory tract. Teeth should be clean with no decay, white with shiny enamel and smooth surfaces and edges. The assessment begins with a dental-health questionnaire, including questions about toothache, hoarseness, dysphagia (difficulty swallowing), altered taste or a frequent sore throat, current and previous tobacco use and alcohol consumption and any sores, lesions or bleeding of the gums. Hydrogen peroxide (H2O2) is the active ingredient most commonly used in whitening products and is delivered as either hydrogen peroxide or carbamide peroxide. Hydrogen peroxide is analogous to carbamide peroxide as it is released when the stable complex is in contact with water. When it diffuses into the tooth, hydrogen peroxide acts as an oxidising agent that breaks down to produce unstable free radicals. In the spaces between the inorganic salts in tooth enamel, these unstable free radicals attach to organic pigment molecules resulting in small, less heavily pigmented components. Reflecting less light, these smaller molecules create a "whitening effect". Peroxyacids are an alternative to hydrogen peroxide and also contribute to the breakdown of pigment molecules.
