In 2019, Ripken debuted with the Holly Springs Salamanders, where he retrieved bats and returned them free of saliva or bite marks. These traits helped Ripken to be noticed by the Durham Bulls, who recruited him in 2020. In 2021, Ripken began working for the Wolfpack by collecting kickoff tees.

They ran a successful costume jewellery business through the 1980s until the stock market crash of 1987 resulted in almost complete bankruptcy. In 1989, Don made his television debut as a regular on This Morning with a gardening segment, which led to further television work across the decade including his own shows for BBC Television and Channel 4. He began his writing career at this time and published his first of over 25 books in 1990. Their duties may include searching for drugs and explosives, locating missing people, finding crime scene evidence, protecting officers and other people, and attacking suspects who flee from officers. In cases where there are insufficient immune responses, the disease is usually described by the secondary disease that results.
