It has the virtues of being both easy to tie and untie; most notably, it is easy to untie after being subjected to a load. It is said[by whom.] to be stronger The bowline () is an ancient and simple knot used to form a fixed loop at the end of a rope. Similar to the double bowline, the water bowline is made by forming a clove hitch before the working end is threaded through. The bowline is sometimes referred to as king of the knots because of its importance 597c010768

Although the bowline is generally considered a reliable knot, its main deficiencies are a tendency to work loose when not under load (or under cyclic loading), to slip when pulled sideways, and the bight portion of the knot to capsize in certain circumstances.
