Relapsing fever A rash may also occur Relapsing fever is a vector-borne disease caused by infection with certain bacteria in the genus *Borrelia*, which is transmitted through the bites of lice, soft-bodied ticks (genus *Ornithodoros*), or hard-bodied ticks (genus *Ixodes*). and 15 days after they are bitten.
