Variations in traffic light operation In traffic engineering, there are regional and national variations in traffic light operation. This light begins blinking with enough time for the driver to see it and slow down before the intersection light turns yellow, then red. a distance. Traffic light Traffic lights, traffic signals, or stoplights - also known as robots in South Africa, Zambia, and Namibia - are signalling devices positioned at road intersections, pedestrian crossings, and other locations to control the flow of traffic. The usual traffic light colors are red to stop traffic, amber to signal a change, and green to allow traffic to proceed. arrows and bicycle symbols c121efc2bd

Mechanical signalling in all States followed British practice using route signalling with slight differences between States. The basic running signal was the Home signal, an absolute stop signal with a red arm. Route signalling was used to indicate the line to be taken at junctions. Advance warning was given by a Distant signals. Subsidiary signals for shunting moves differed between States, just as they did between the different railway companies in Britain.

␣ Traffic lights were first introduced in December 1868 on Parliament Square in London to reduce the need for police officers to control traffic. Since then, electricity and computerized control have advanced traffic light technology and increased intersection capacity. The system is also used for other purposes, including the control of pedestrian movements, variable lane control (such as tidal flow systems or smart motorways), and railway level crossings.

Automotive lighting A motor vehicle has lighting and signaling devices mounted to or integrated into its front, rear, sides, and, in some cases, top. , with lights also indicating the size of some large vehicles. are blinking lights mounted near the left and right front and rear corners of a vehicle, and sometimes on the sides or on the side mirrors of a vehicle. Automotive lighting is functional exterior lighting in vehicles. Various devices have the dual function of illuminating the road ahead for the driver, and making the vehicle visible to others, with indications to them of turning, slowing or stopping, etc

Tail lights and brake lights were introduced around 1915, and by 1919, low-beam or dipped beam... Signalling practice, however, diverged with the introduction of power signalling into each State. New South Wales was first significant adopter of power signalling. It adopted the then standard international practice of displaying three aspects using home above distant signals; this developed into an integrated mechanical/power signalling practice based on route signalling.

Emergency vehicle lighting refers to any of several visual warning devices, which may be known as lightbars or beacons, fitted to a vehicle and used when the driver wishes to convey to other road users the urgency of their journey, to provide additional warning of a hazard when stationary, or in the case of law enforcement as a means of signalling another motorist that a traffic stop is being initiated. These lights may be dedicated emergency lights, such as a beacon or a lightbar, or modified stock lighting, such as a wig-wag or hideaway light, and are additional to any standard lighting on the car such as hazard lights. They are often used along with a siren system to increase their effectiveness and provide audible warnings alongside the visual warnings produced by the lights. Many emergency vehicles have distinctive lighting equipment to warn drivers of their presence.

Emergency vehicle lighting often red lights mounted to the front or roof of a vehicle. A sub-type of emergency vehicle equipment, emergency vehicle lighting is generally used by emergency vehicles and other authorized vehicles in a variety of colors. As a result Emergency vehicle lighting, also known as simply emergency lighting or emergency lights, is a type of vehicle lighting used to visually announce a vehicle's presence to other road users. The use of the blue emergency light originates in Germany during World War II

Early road vehicles used fuelled lamps before the availability of electric lighting. The first Ford Model T used carbide lamps for headlights and oil lamps for tail lights. It did not have all-electric lighting as a standard feature until several years after its introduction. Dynamos for automobile headlights were first fitted around 1908 and became commonplace in 1920s automobiles. Traffic lights usually consist of three signals, conveying meaningful information to road users through colors and symbols, including arrows and bicycle symbols. The usual traffic light colors are red to stop traffic, amber to signal a change, and green to allow

traffic to proceed. These are arranged vertically or horizontally in that order. Although this is internationally standardized, variations in traffic light sequences and laws exist on national and local scales.

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
