As of 2026, physician-assisted suicide, or "medical aid in dying", is legal in fourteen US jurisdictions: Illinois, California, Colorado, Delaware, the District of Columbia, Hawaii, Montana, Maine, New Jersey, New York, New Mexico, Oregon, Vermont, and Washington. These laws (excluding Montana, where there is no explicit legislation) state that "actions taken in accordance... Mechanism of action The eldest son of the Rev. James Esdaile, D.D. Assisted suicide is similar to, but distinct from, euthanasia (sometimes called "mercy killing"). In cases of euthanasia, another party acts to bring about the person's death, in order to end ongoing suffering. In cases of assisted suicide, a second person provides the means through which the individual is able to voluntarily end their own life, but they do not directly cause the individual's death. Confucianism holds that one should give up one's life, if necessary, either passively or actively, for the sake of upholding the cardinal moral values of ren (altruism) and yi (righteousness). Which is referred as "Death with Dignity" dying for a greater cause.

Lethal injection The drugs cause the person to become unconscious, stop breathing, and develop a heart arrhythmia, in that order. Some patients have taken days to die, and a few patients have Lethal injection is the practice of injecting one or more drugs into a person

(typically a barbiturate, paralytic, and potassium chloride) for the express purpose of causing death. producing a so-called painless death, but the time required to cause death can be prolonged. The main application for this procedure is capital punishment, but the term may also be applied in a broader sense to include euthanasia and other forms of suicide 3a0c248286

In humans, establishing death of the brain is the most certain metric for evaluating whether an individual has died. While death as an inevitable end state may be achieved through aging, death can occur at any stage of human development, including in infancy. Eventually, the heat death of the universe is expected to render life impossible anywhere in the universe, effectively making death the eventual end state of the cosmos as a whole. It is the irreversible cessation of biological functions that sustain a living organism. A person may experience clinical death that is nonetheless reversible, resulting in some cases in a near-death experience. Death is the inevitable end state for all living things, as nature's tendency to disorder will cause all living systems to degrade and fail through various causes. the most certain metric for evaluating whether an individual has died. Some organisms, such as the immortal jellyfish, are biologically immortal; nonetheless, they can still die from causes other than the effects of aging. People who survive either because the cord or its anchor point of attachment breaks, or because they are discovered and cut down, can face a range of serious injuries, including cerebral anoxia (which can lead to permanent brain damage), laryngeal fracture, cervical fracture, tracheal fracture, pharyngeal laceration, and carotid artery injury. The term is often used interchangeably with "physician-assisted suicide" (PAS), "physician-assisted dying", "physician-assisted death", and "assisted death" 3a0c248286

First developed in the United States, the method has become a legal means of execution in China, Thailand, Guatemala, Taiwan, the Maldives, Nigeria, and Vietnam, though Guatemala abolished the death penalty for civilian cases in 2017 and has not conducted an execution since 2000, and the Maldives has never carried out an execution since its independence. Although Taiwan permits lethal injection as an execution method, no executions have been carried out in this manner; the same is true for Nigeria. Lethal injection was also used in the Philippines until the country re-abolished the death penalty in 2006. 3a0c248286 Different countries have different euthanasia laws. The British House of Lords select committee on medical ethics defines euthanasia as "a deliberate intervention undertaken with the express intention of ending a life to relieve intractable suffering". In the Netherlands and Belgium, euthanasia is understood as "termination of life by a doctor at the request of a patient".
