Red or brown spots are often seen on the skin, typically around the chest, forehead, and back. These mast cells, when irritated (e.g. by rubbing the skin, heat exposure), produce too much histamine, triggering an allergic reaction that leads to hives localized to the area of irritation, sometimes referred to as Darier's sign. Severe itching usually follows, and scratching the area only serves to further symptoms. They have two main life stages, nymphal and adult. The nymphal period consists of 5 instar stages each similar but unique in their own manners lasting a total of 8-16 days. The first instar stage occurs after hatching and lasts typically 2-4 days, the molt is oblong shaped and transforms from a pale brown to a brownish-black coloured cuticle. The second instar also typically lasts 2-4 days, it remains a dark brown-black colour but the molt is rounded instead, the abdominal surface have indications of spinal projections along the body's margin. The third instar typically lasts 2-3 days and the molt remains round but larger in size with short cephalic spines. Over the last two decades Goddard has served as an educational resource concerning medically important arthropods to a U.S. Congressional Committee, in various newspapers and magazines such as Reader's Digest, and on television programs such as The Learning Channel ("Living with Bugs") and the Colbert Report. == Symptoms and signs == As a term, "Love bite" is first attested in 1749 in John Cleland's *Memoirs of a Woman of Pleasure*. The later term 'hickey', originally used in American English and still predominantly in that dialect, is of unclear etymology. Some sources suggests that it derives from the earlier meaning of "pimple, skin lesion" (c. 1915), itself perhaps a sense extension of "small gadget, device; any unspecified object" (1909). Cat bites are usually considered minor injuries but can result in serious infection and cause rabies if inflicted by a rabid cat. Common symptoms include pain and swelling around the affected area. Sometimes, direct tissue damage from the cat bite can impair mobility or cause tenosynovitis or arthritis. In these cases, surgical consultation is needed to assess severity. Some unusual complications, like deep-vein thrombosis, subcutaneous emphysema and fetal tachycardia have been described. Some of the infections acquired from a cat bite can be acquired otherwise, like plague. *Orius insidiosus* adults are approximately 3 mm in length. This oval-shaped insect is black with white patches on the wings. Nymphs of this species are teardrop-shaped and wingless. They range from yellow-orange to brown in colour. Bed bug bites are caused primarily by two species of insects: *Cimex lectularius* (the common bed bug) and *Cimex hemipterus*, found primarily in the tropics. Their size ranges between 1 and 7 mm. They spread by crawling between nearby locations or by being carried within personal items. Infestation is rarely due to a lack of hygiene but is more common in high-density areas. Diagnosis involves both finding the bugs and the occurrence of compatible symptoms. Bed bugs spend much of their time in dark, hidden locations like mattress seams, or cracks in a wall.

Triatominae also known as conenose bugs, kissing bugs (so-called from their habit of feeding from around the mouths of people), or vampire bugs. In areas where Chagas disease occurs (from the southern United States to northern Argentina), all triatomine species are potential vectors of the Chagas disease parasite *Trypanosoma cruzi*, but only those species that are well adapted to living with humans (such as *Triatoma infestans* and *Rhodnius prolixus*) are considered important vectors. These bugs usually share shelter with nesting vertebrates, from which they suck blood. They are mainly found and widespread in the Americas, with a few species present in Asia and Africa. Most of the 130 or more species of this subfamily feed on vertebrate blood; a very small portion of species feed on invertebrates. Other local names for The members of the Triatominae , a subfamily of the Reduviidae, are also known as conenose bugs, kissing bugs (so-called from their habit of feeding from around the mouths of people), or vampire bugs. Also, proteins released from their bites have been known to induce anaphylaxis in sensitive and sensitized individuals. Other local names for them, used in Latin America and by Latinos generally, include barbeiros, vinchucas, pitos, chipos and chinchas

== See also == The centipede's venom causes pain and swelling in the area of the bite, and may cause other reactions throughout the body. The majority of bites are not life-threatening to humans and present the greatest risk to children and those who develop allergic reactions.

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
