Upon graduating from the naval academy Carrero Blanco participated in the Rif War, and later the Spanish Civil War, in which he supported the Nationalist faction. He became one of the most prominent figures in Francoist Spain's power structure and held throughout his career a number of high-ranking offices such as those of Minister-Under Secretary of the Presidency from 1941 to 1967 and Franco's deputy prime minister from 1967 to 1973. He also was the main drafter behind the 1947 Law of Succession to the Headship of the State. Franco handpicked him as his successor in the role of head of government, with Carrero thereby taking office in June 1973. 1283c16c90 José Gregorio Hernández Cisneros was born on 26 October 1864 in Isnotú, a small village in the State of Trujillo in Venezuela. He was one of the six children of Benigno María Hernández y Manzaneda and Josefa Antonia Cisneros y Mansilla. == Family and youth == 1283c16c90 == Biography == 1283c16c90 == Life == 1283c16c90 Shortly after he became prime minister, Carrero Blanco was assassinated in December 1973 by a cache of explosives placed in a tunnel by the Basque nationalist group Euskadi Ta Askatasuna (ETA). 1283c16c90 Initially they based their propositions on three primary themes: the problem of personal identity, the limits of the individual, and share space in the tu-yo dialectic and that of the natural elements. The body and the approach to nature were central themes of their research and reflections in the search for vital keys of creation and life. They framed the self-designed and interiorist affiliation with the ecological calls of the 20th century avant-garde and with primitive symbolism of the natural world, producing moving conceptual and aesthetic proposals of both humanity and nature, "the body of one as the body of the world" (good/bad of the planet as good/bad of the being).
