Ectopic thymus most often does not cause symptoms. It is most frequently discovered as a soft mass or swelling in the neck of infants and children. However, when symptoms do occur they are most commonly due to compression of nearby structures such as the trachea and esophagus. Its inflorescences are dense and capituliform. It has elliptic, ciliate bracts that are 4–6 mm (0.16–0.24 in) long and 1.3–2.5 mm (0.051–0.098 in) wide. Ectopia cordis, the displacement of the heart outside the body during fetal development Unlike the circulatory system, which is a closed system, the lymphatic system is open. Lymph originates in the interstitial fluid that leaks from blood in the circulatory system into the tissues of the body. This fluid carries nutrients to the cells and collects waste products, bacteria, and damaged cells, before draining into the lymphatic vessels as lymph. The circulatory system processes an average of 20 litres (5.3 US gal) of blood per day through capillary filtration, which removes plasma from the blood. Roughly 17 litres (4.5 US gal) of the filtered blood is reabsorbed directly into the blood vessels, while the remaining 3 litres (0.79 US gal) are left in the interstitial fluid. The lymphatic system provides an accessory return route to the blood for this remainder. It flowers from May to June.

It is a butterfly-shaped organ consisting of two lobes, located in the top part of the chest, that supports T cell development via specialized microenvironments that ensure a diverse, functional, and self-tolerant T cell population. These microenvironments are classically defined as distinct cortex and medulla regions that each contain specialized subsets of stromal cells. Lining cells (epithelial cells) help the thymocytes develop. T cells that successfully develop react appropriately with MHC immune receptors of the body (called positive selection) and not against proteins of the body (called negative selection). The thymus is largest and most active during the neonatal and pre-adolescent periods. By the early teens, the thymus begins to decrease in size and activity and its tissue is gradually replaced by fatty tissue. Nevertheless, some T cell development continues throughout adult life. c970d8a421

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Thymus T cells are critical to the adaptive immune system, where the body adapts to specific foreign invaders. It is made up of two lobes, each consisting of a central medulla and an outer cortex, surrounded by a capsule. T cells are critical.
