Spiders in the family Atracidae are medium to large in size, with body lengths ranging from 1 to 5 cm (0.39 to 1.97 in), with one exceptional specimen reaching 8 cm (3.1 in). However, not all spiders catch their prey in webs, and some do not build webs at all. The term "spider web" is typically used to refer to a web that is apparently still in use (i.e., clean), whereas "cobweb" refers to a seemingly abandoned (i.e., dusty) web. The word "cobweb" is also used by biologists to describe the tangled three-dimensional web of some spiders of the family Theridiidae. While this large family is known as the cobweb spiders, they actually have a range of different webs.
