There are many causes of infertility, including some that medical intervention can treat. Estimates from 1997, suggest that worldwide about five percent of all heterosexual couples have an unresolved problem with infertility. That figure has been on the rise, with the World Health Organization (WHO) reporting in 2023 that about 17.5% of people experience infertility during their lifetime, while prevalence at a given time point is 12.6%. Preimplantation genetic diagnosis " The term preimplantation genetic screening (PGS) refers to the set of techniques for testing whether Preimplantation genetic diagnosis (PGD or PIGD) is the genetic profiling of embryos prior to implantation (as a form of embryo profiling), and sometimes even of oocytes prior to fertilization. PGD is considered in a similar fashion to prenatal diagnosis. When used to screen for a specific genetic disease, its main advantage is that it avoids selective abortion, as the method makes it highly likely that the baby will be free of the disease under consideration. The latter technique has proved to be less deleterious for the embryo, therefore it is advisable to perform the biopsy around day 5 or 6 of development. resulting in two twin and one singleton pregnancy. PGD thus is an adjunct to assisted reproductive technology, and requires in vitro fertilization (IVF) to obtain oocytes or embryos for evaluation. Breastfeeding Between 2015 and 2020, only about 44% of infants worldwide were exclusively breastfed in the first six months of life. Health organizations including the

WHO recommend exclusively breastfeeding for six months; this means that no other foods or drinks—other than vitamin D supplement—are typically given. The World Health Organization (WHO) recommends that breastfeeding begin within the first hour of a newborn's birth and continue as the baby wants. Infants may suckle directly from the breast, or milk may be extracted with a pump and then fed to the infant. Although traditionally, lactation occurs following pregnancy, lactation may also occur before pregnancy. Breastfeeding, also known as nursing, is the process whereby breast milk is fed to an infant or toddler. Feedback loops that naturally occur after the placenta is delivered. The WHO recommends then continuing breastfeeding with appropriate complementary foods for up to 2 years, and beyond.

History of abortion But in what follows the term abortion will always refer to an induced abortion. Spontaneous abortion, is sometimes used to refer to a naturally occurring condition that ends a pregnancy, that is, to what is popularly called a miscarriage. The practice of induced abortion—the deliberate termination of a pregnancy—has been known since ancient times. The term abortion, or more precisely spontaneous abortion, is sometimes used to refer to a naturally occurring condition that ends a pregnancy, that is, to what is popularly called a miscarriage. Infertility disease of the reproductive system defined by the failure to achieve a clinical pregnancy after 12 months or more of regular unprotected sexual intercourse In biology, infertility is the inability of a male and female organism to reproduce. As a medical term, infertility does not apply before and after the normal period of natural, age-dependent reproductive function: in children before puberty, or in women after menopause. It is usually not the natural state of a healthy organism that has reached sexual maturity

Menstrual cup Its purpose is to collect menstrual fluid (blood from the uterine lining mixed with other fluids). It is impermeable and collects menstrual fluid, unlike tampons and menstrual pads, which absorb it. prevent pregnancy. Menstrual cups are made of elastomers (silicone rubbers, latex rubbers, or thermoplastic rubbers). After each A menstrual cup is a menstrual hygiene device which is inserted into the vagina during menstruation. A properly fitting menstrual cup seals against the vaginal walls, so tilting and inverting the body will not cause it to leak. Every 4–12 hours (depending on capacity and the amount of flow), the cup is emptied (usually removed, rinsed, and reinserted)

Periodic abstinence, the crux of NFP, is deemed moral by the Church for avoiding or postponing pregnancy for just reasons. When used to avoid pregnancy, couples may engage in sexual intercourse during a woman's naturally occurring infertile times such as during portions of her ovulatory cycle. Various methods may be used to identify whether a woman is likely to be fertile; this information may be used in attempts to either avoid or achieve pregnancy.
