== History == The cup is named after American art collector Edward Perry Warren, its first modern owner. It divides a pound into 12 ounces, an ounce into 8 drachms, and a drachm into 3 scruples The apothecaries' system, or apothecaries' weights and measures, is a historical system of mass and volume units that were used by physicians and apothecaries for medical prescriptions, and also sometimes by scientists. The apothecaries' system of measures is a similar system of volume units based on the fluid ounce. For a long time, medical recipes were written in Latin, often using special symbols to denote weights and measures. This exact form of the system was used in the United Kingdom; in some of its former colonies, it survived well into the 20th century.
