Chemical weapons in World War I Estimates go up to about 90,000 fatalities and a total of about 1. The types of weapons employed ranged from disabling chemicals, such as tear gas, to lethal agents like chlorine, phosgene, and mustard gas. They were primarily used to demoralize, injure, and kill entrenched defenders, against whom the indiscriminate and generally very slow-moving or static nature of gas clouds would be most effective. In survivors, gas attacks caused medical problems and a strong psychological impact. Austria-Hungary, France, the German Empire, the United Kingdom, and the United States used chemical weapons on the battlefield. This chemical warfare was a major component of the first global war and first total war of the 20th century. 3 million Chemical warfare dates back thousands of years, but the first large-scale use of chemical weapons was during World War I 879441633f

On 9 September 1940, Italian aircraft bombed Tel Aviv in what was the deadliest air raid in Palestine during the war. The first two major conflicts in which Finland was directly involved were the defensive Winter War against an invasion by the Soviet Union in 1939, followed by the offensive Continuation War, together with Germany and the other Axis powers against the Soviets, in 1941-1944. The third conflict, the Lapland War against Germany in 1944-1945, followed the signing of the Moscow Armistice with the Allied Powers, which stipulated expulsion of Nazi German forces from Finnish territory. 879441633f Switzerland was adjacent to and at times almost completely surrounded by

Axis, or Axis-occupied, countries. On several occasions, Allied bombing raids hit targets in Switzerland resulting in fatalities and property damage. The Swiss government initially intercepted German aircraft in 1940 during the Battle of France but caved to German pressure and stopped intercepting their aircraft. Such events led to diplomatic exchanges. While Allied forces explained the causes of violations as navigation errors, equipment failure, weather conditions, and pilots' errors, fear was expressed in Switzerland that some neutrality violations were intended to exert pressure on the country to end its economic cooperation with Nazi Germany. In addition to bombing raids, air attacks by individual fighter planes strafed Swiss targets toward the end of the war.
