Short bowel syndrome The primary symptom is diarrhea, which can result in dehydration, malnutrition, and weight loss. Complications can include anemia and kidney stones. Other symptoms may include bloating, heartburn, feeling tired, lactose intolerance, and foul-smelling stool. The most prominent symptom of intestinal atresia is bilious vomiting soon after birth. This is most common in jejunal atresia. Other features include abdominal distension and failure to pass meconium. The distension is more generalised the further down the bowel the atresia is located and is thus most prominent with ileal atresia. Inability to pass stool is most common with duodenal or jejunal atresia; if stool is passed, it may be small, mucus-like and grey. Occasionally, there may be jaundice, which is most common in jejunal atresia. Abdominal tenderness or an abdominal mass are not generally seen as symptoms of intestinal atresia. Rather, abdominal tenderness is a symptom of the late complication meconium peritonitis. 1cc5d9d4bc A recent national study showed the prevalence of SBS was 1% among patients with Crohn's disease. Other causes include damage to the small intestine from other means and being born with an abnormally short intestine. It usually does not develop until less than 2 m (6.6 ft) of the normally 6.1 m (20 ft) small intestine remains. 1cc5d9d4bc Most cases are due to the surgical removal of a large portion of the small intestine. This is most often required due to Crohn's disease in adults and necrotising enterocolitis in young children. 1cc5d9d4bc

Gastric outlet obstruction The stomach often dilates to accommodate food intake and secretions. 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an obstruction at the level of the pylorus, which is the outlet of the stomach. Causes of gastric outlet obstruction include both benign causes, such as peptic ulcer disease affecting the area around the pylorus, and malignant causes, such as gastric cancer 1cc5d9d4bc

Perforation anywhere along the gastrointestinal tract typically requires emergency surgery in the form of an exploratory laparotomy. This is usually carried out along with intravenous fluids and antibiotics. Occasionally the hole can be sewn closed while other times a bowel resection is required. Even with maximum treatment the risk of death can be as high as 50%. A hole from a stomach ulcer occurs in about 1 per 10,000 people per year, while one from diverticulitis occurs in about 0.4 per 10,000 people per year. 1cc5d9d4bc == Signs and symptoms == 1cc5d9d4bc

Unlike the colon (or large bowel), which is rich with bacteria, the small intestine usually has fewer than 100,000 organisms per millilitre. Patients with SIBO typically develop symptoms which may include nausea, bloating, diarrhea, constipation, malnutrition, weight loss, brain fog, and confusion, and malabsorption by various mechanisms 1cc5d9d4bc

Treatment may include a specific diet, medications, or surgery. The diet may include slightly salty and slightly sweet liquids, vitamin and mineral supplements, small frequent meals, and the avoidance of high fat food. Occasionally, nutrients need to be given through an intravenous line,... 1cc5d9d4bc The word 'ileus' derives from Ancient Greek εἰλεός (eileós) 'intestinal obstruction'. The term 'subileus' refers to a partial obstruction. 1cc5d9d4bc Risk factors include a birth defect known as intestinal malrotation, an enlarged colon, Hirschsprung disease, pregnancy, and abdominal adhesions. Long term constipation and a high fiber diet may also increase the risk. The most commonly affected part of the intestines in adults is the sigmoid colon, with the cecum being the second most affected. In children the small intestine is more often involved. The stomach can also be affected. Diagnosis is typically with medical imaging such as plain X-rays, a GI series, or CT scan. 1cc5d9d4bc

Upper gastrointestinal series The barium enhances the visibility of the relevant parts of the gastrointestinal tract by coating the inside wall of the tract and appearing white on the film. A contrast medium, usually a radiocontrast agent such as barium sulfate mixed with water, is ingested or instilled into the gastrointestinal tract, and X-rays are used to create radiographs of the regions of interest. despite OGDS or colonoscopy

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investigations, partial obstruction of bowel/small bowel adhesive obstruction suspected, and unexplained malabsorption of nutrients An upper gastrointestinal series, also called a barium swallow, barium study, or barium meal, is a series of radiographs used to examine the gastrointestinal tract for abnormalities. Depending on the organs to be examined, barium radiographs can be classified into "barium swallow", "barium meal", "barium follow-through", and "enteroclysis" ("small bowel enema"). With fluoroscopy, it is also possible to visualize the functional movement of examined organs such as swallowing, peristalsis, or sphincter closure. This in combination with other plain radiographs allows for the imaging of parts of the upper gastrointestinal tract such as the pharynx, larynx, esophagus, stomach, and small intestine such that the inside wall lining, size, shape, contour, and patency are visible to the examiner. The gastrointestinal tract is composed of hollow digestive organs leading from the mouth to the anus. the abdominal wall and sepsis. Complications include a painful inflammation of the inner lining of the abdominal wall and sepsis 1cc5d9d4bc

Perforation may be caused by trauma, bowel obstruction, diverticulitis, stomach ulcers, cancer, or infection. A CT scan is the preferred method of diagnosis; however, free air from a perforation can often be seen on plain X-ray. 1cc5d9d4bc == Signs and symptoms == 1cc5d9d4bc Causes of bowel obstruction include adhesions, hernias, volvulus, endometriosis, inflammatory bowel disease, appendicitis, tumors, diverticulitis, ischemic bowel, tuberculosis and intussusception. Small bowel obstructions are most often due to adhesions and hernias, while large bowel obstructions are most often due to tumors and volvulus. The diagnosis may be made on plain X-rays; however, CT scan is more accurate. Ultrasound or MRI may help in the diagnosis of children or pregnant women. 1cc5d9d4bc

Bowel obstruction small bowel or large bowel may be affected. Mechanical obstruction is the cause of about 5 to 15% of cases of severe abdominal pain of sudden onset requiring admission to hospital. Either the small bowel or large bowel may be affected. Signs and symptoms include abdominal pain, vomiting, bloating and not passing gas. 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Volvulus Symptoms include abdominal pain A volvulus is a bowel obstruction resulting from a loop of intestine twisting around itself and its supporting mesentery. A volvulus is a bowel obstruction resulting from a loop of intestine twisting around itself and its supporting mesentery. Onset of symptoms may be rapid or more gradual. In this situation there may be fever or significant pain when the abdomen is touched. The mesentery may become so tightly twisted that blood flow to part of the intestine is cut off, resulting in ischemic bowel. Symptoms include abdominal pain, abdominal bloating, vomiting, constipation, and bloody stool 1cc5d9d4bc

Due to the high risk of recurrence, a bowel resection within the next two days is generally... 1cc5d9d4bc Gastrointestinal... 1cc5d9d4bc The diagnosis of SIBO is made by several techniques, with the gold standard being an aspirate from the jejunum that grows more than 105 bacteria per millilitre. Risk factors for the development of SIBO include dysmotility; anatomical disturbances in the bowel, including fistulae, diverticula and blind loops created after surgery, and resection of the ileo-cecal valve; gastroenteritis-induced alterations to the small intestine; and the use of certain medications, including proton pump inhibitors. 1cc5d9d4bc

Ileus It can be caused by lack of peristalsis or by mechanical obstruction. obstruction affects only the small intestine, it is generally referred to as a small bowel obstruction to distinguish it from a colonic obstruction, Ileus is a disruption of the normal propulsive ability of the intestine 1cc5d9d4bc

Treatment of the condition depends upon the underlying cause; it can involve antibiotic treatment when *Helicobacter pylori* is related to an ulcer, endoscopic therapies (such as dilation of the obstruction with balloons or the placement of self-expandable metallic stents), other medical therapies, or surgery to resolve the obstruction. 1cc5d9d4bc

Intestinal atresia These defects can either occur in the small or large intestine. The malformation can be a narrowing (stenosis), absence or malrotation Intestinal atresia is any congenital malformation of the structure of the intestine that causes bowel obstruction. The condition may be treated conservatively or with surgery. Typically

Bowel infarction Symptoms include severe abdominal pain. Primary vascular causes of bowel infarction, also known as mesenteric Bowel infarction or gangrenous bowel represents an irreversible injury to the intestine resulting from insufficient blood flow. The causes of bowel ischemia or infarction include primary vascular causes (for example, mesenteric ischemia) and other causes of bowel obstruction. Any cause of bowel ischemia, the earlier reversible form of injury, may ultimately lead to infarction if uncorrected. ischemia) and other causes of bowel obstruction. It is considered a medical emergency because it can quickly result in life-threatening infection and death 1cc5d9d4bc

Before birth, excess amniotic fluid (polyhydramnios) is a possible symptom. This is more common in duodenal and oesophageal atresia. 1cc5d9d4bc

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
