Thuja The genus is monophyletic and sister to Thujopsis. Members are commonly known as arborvitaes (from the Latin term for 'tree of life'), thuja, or New World false cedars. In the 19th century, Thuja was commonly used as an externally applied tincture or ointment for the treatment of warts, ringworm and thrush, and a Thuja (THEW-yə) is a genus of coniferous tree or shrub in the Cupressaceae (cypress family).
