Aquatic ecosystem Freshwater ecosystems may be lentic (slow moving water, including pools, ponds, and lakes); lotic (faster moving water, for example streams and rivers); and wetlands (areas where the soil is saturated or inundated for at least part of the time). Human impact on the environment directly or indirectly by humans. Modifying the environment to fit the needs of society (as in the built environment) is causing severe effects including global warming, environmental degradation (such as ocean acidification), mass extinction, and biodiversity loss, ecological crisis, and ecological collapse. Some of the problems, including global warming and biodiversity loss, have been proposed as representing catastrophic risks to the survival of the human species. Some human activities that cause damage (either directly or indirectly) to the environment on a global scale include population growth, neoliberal economic policies, and rapid economic growth. Overconsumption,

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overexploitation, pollution, and deforestation are also contributing to this problem. Sediment quality triad Although the SQT approach does not provide a cause-and-effect relationship linking concentrations of individual chemicals to adverse biological effects, it does provide an assessment of sediment quality commonly used to explain sediment characteristics quantitatively. This evaluation focuses on three main components: 1.) sediment chemistry, 2. The information provided by each portion of the SQT is unique and complementary, and the combination of these portions is necessary because no single characteristic provides comprehensive information regarding a specific site (Chapman, 1997). to human activity present in aquatic environments (Chapman, 1990).) sediment In aquatic toxicology, the sediment quality triad (SQT) approach has been used as an assessment tool to evaluate the extent of sediment

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degradation resulting from contaminants released due to human activity present in aquatic environments (Chapman, 1990). Often used in risk assessment, the combination of three lines of evidence can lead to a comprehensive understanding of the possible effects to the aquatic community (Chapman, 1997). 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Biological interaction created two different classifications for biotic interactions, one based on the time (long-term and short-term interactions) and other based on the magnitude In ecology, a biological interaction is the effect that a pair of organisms living together in a community have on each other. These effects may be short-term or long-term; both often strongly influence the adaptation and evolution of the species involved. Interactions can be direct when bodily contact is established or indirect through intermediaries such as shared resources, territories, ecological services, metabolic waste, toxins, or growth inhibitors. This type of relationship can be shown by net effect based on individual effects on both organisms arising out of relationship. They can be either of the same species (intraspecific interactions), or of different species (interspecific interactions). Biological interactions range from mutualism, beneficial to both partners, to competition, harmful to both partners 22a72b1dcb

The concept of ecological niche is central to ecological biogeography, which... 22a72b1dcb Complete ecological units that

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function as natural systems without massive civilized human intervention, including all vegetation, microorganisms, soil, rocks, plateaus, mountains, the atmosphere and natural phenomena that occur within their boundaries and their nature. 22a72b1dcb A Grinnellian niche is determined by the habitat in which a species lives and its accompanying behavioral adaptations. An Eltonian niche emphasizes that a species not only grows in and responds to an environment, it may also change the environment and its behavior as it grows. The Hutchinsonian niche uses mathematics and statistics to try to explain how species coexist within a given community. 22a72b1dcb

Ecological niche It describes how an organism or population responds to the distribution of resources and competitors (for example, by growing when resources are abundant, and when predators, parasites and pathogens are scarce) and how it, in turn, alters those same factors (for example, limiting access to resources by other organisms, acting as a food source for predators and a consumer of prey). "The type and number of variables comprising the dimensions of an environmental niche vary from one species to another [and] the relative importance of particular environmental variables for a species may vary according to the geographic and biotic contexts". British ecologist, defined a niche as follows: "The 'niche' of an animal means its place in the biotic environment, its relations to food and enemies." Elton In ecology, a niche is the match of a species to a specific environmental condition 22a72b1dcb

Biotic stress fungus, or the browning caused by anthracnose, a fairly minor leaf disease. Biotic stress remains a broadly defined term and those who study it face many challenges, such as the greater difficulty in controlling biotic stresses in an experimental context compared to abiotic stress. Biotic stressors are a major focus of agricultural research, due to the vast economic Biotic stress is stress that occurs as a result of damage done to an organism by other living organisms, such as bacteria, viruses, fungi, parasites, beneficial and harmful insects, weeds, and cultivated or native plants. The types of biotic stresses imposed on an organism depend the climate where it lives as well as the species' ability to resist

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particular stresses. It is different from abiotic stress, which is the negative impact of non-living factors on the organisms such as temperature, sunlight, wind, salinity, flooding and drought 22a72b1dcb

Philosophy of ecology Evolution results from the 'generation of variety' as a means to produce change. This topic also overlaps with metaphysics, ontology, and epistemology, for example, as it attempts to answer metaphysical, epistemic and moral issues surrounding environmental ethics and public policy. components. Its main concerns centre on the practice and application of ecology, its moral issues, and the intersectionality between the position of humans and other entities. The damage caused by these various living and nonliving agents can appear very similar. Even with close observation, accurate diagnosis can be difficult. For example, browning of leaves on an oak tree caused by drought stress may appear similar to leaf browning caused by oak wilt, a serious vascular disease caused by a fungus, or the browning caused by anthracnose, a fairly minor leaf disease... 22a72b1dcb Several recent studies have suggested non-trophic species interactions such as habitat modification and mutualisms can be important determinants of food web structures. However, it remains unclear whether these findings generalize across ecosystems, and whether non-trophic interactions affect food webs randomly or affect specific trophic levels or functional groups. 22a72b1dcb The aim of the philosophy of ecology is to clarify and critique the 'first principles', which are the fundamental assumptions present in science and the natural sciences. Although there has yet to be a consensus about what presupposes philosophy of ecology, and the

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definition for ecology is up for debate, there are some central issues that philosophers of ecology consider when examining the role and purpose of what ecologists practice. For example, this field considers the 'nature of nature', the methodological and conceptual issues surrounding ecological research, and the problems associated with these studies within its contextual environment.
