Losartan/hydrochlorothiazide Serious side effects may include low blood Losartan/hydrochlorothiazide, sold under the brand name Hyzaar among others, is a fixed-dose combination medication used to treat high blood pressure when losartan is not sufficient. Common side effects include dizziness, back pain, and upper respiratory tract infections. It is taken by mouth. It consists of losartan, an angiotensin II receptor blocker; and hydrochlorothiazide, a thiazide diuretic

Other common causes include gastroesophageal reflux disease (30%), muscle or skeletal pain (28%), pneumonia (2%), shingles (0.5%), pleuritis, traumatic and anxiety disorders. Determining the cause of chest pain is based on a person's medical history, a physical exam and other medical tests. It is available as a generic medication. In 2023, it was the 65th most commonly prescribed medication in the United States, with more than 9 million prescriptions. cf0b1aa179 Pulpitis is reversible when the pain is mild to moderate and lasts for a short time after a stimulus (for instance cold); or irreversible when the pain is severe, spontaneous, and lasts a long time after a stimulus. Left untreated, pulpitis may become irreversible, then progress to pulp necrosis (death of the pulp) and apical periodontitis. Abscesses usually cause throbbing pain. The apical abscess usually occurs after pulp necrosis, the pericoronal abscess is usually associated... cf0b1aa179 Infection of a tumor or its surrounding tissue can cause rapidly escalating pain, but is sometimes overlooked as a possible cause. One study found that infection was the cause of pain in four percent of nearly 300 cancer patients referred for pain relief. Another report described seven patients, whose previously well-controlled pain escalated significantly over several days. Antibiotic treatment produced pain relief in all patients within three days. cf0b1aa179

The word "humerus" is derived from Late Latin humerus, from Latin umerus, meaning upper arm, shoulder, and is linguistically related to Gothic ams (shoulder) and Greek ōmos. cf0b1aa179 The thoracic spine begins at the base of the neck and extends to the middle of the trunk. Humerus The medial supracondylar crest forms the sharp medial border of the distal humerus continuing The humerus (; pl. the ulnar nerve runs in a groove on the back of this epicondyle. The lower extremity consists of 2 epicondyles, 2 processes (trochlea and capitulum), and 3 fossae (radial fossa, coronoid fossa, and olecranon fossa). As well as its true anatomical neck, the constriction below the greater and lesser tubercles of the humerus is referred to as its surgical neck due to its tendency to fracture, thus often becoming the focus of surgeons. The humeral upper extremity consists of a rounded head, a narrow neck, and two short processes (tubercles, sometimes called tuberosities). Middle back pain Middle back pain, also known as thoracic back pain, is back pain that is felt in the region of the thoracic vertebrae,

PSPS type 2 replaces the older term failed back surgery syndrome (FBSS), which is now considered medically inadequate and potentially pejorative. While 'post-laminectomy syndrome' is still used by some clinicians, PSPS is the preferred label under ICD-11. Many factors can contribute to the onset or development of FBSS, including residual or recurrent spinal disc herniation, persistent post-operative pressure on a spinal nerve, altered joint mobility, joint hypermobility with instability, scar tissue (fibrosis), depression, anxiety, sleeplessness, spinal muscular deconditioning, and Cutibacterium acnes infection. An individual may be predisposed to the development of FBSS by comorbid systemic diseases, including diabetes, autoimmune diseases, and peripheral vascular disease. cf0b1aa179 The exact symptoms associated with middle back pain will depend upon the underlying cause. Most middle back pain is not serious in nature. However, it does tend to have more serious pathology associated with it than pain in the neck or low... cf0b1aa179 Simple over-the-counter pain medications are useful in 20% to 70% of cases of common acute... cf0b1aa179 Common causes include inflammation of the pulp (usually in response to tooth decay, dental trauma, or other factors), dentin hypersensitivity, apical periodontitis (inflammation of the periodontal ligament and alveolar bone around the root apex), dental abscesses (localized collections of pus), alveolar osteitis ("dry socket", a possible complication of tooth extraction), acute necrotizing ulcerative gingivitis (a gum infection), and temporomandibular disorder. cf0b1aa179

Sacroiliac joint It is a synovial plane joint with irregular elevations and depressions that produce interlocking of the two bones. In humans, the sacrum supports the spine and is supported in turn by an ilium on each side. Pain is typically The sacroiliac joint or SI joint (SIJ) is the joint between the sacrum and the ilium bones of the pelvis, which are connected by strong ligaments. The joint is strong, supporting the entire weight of the upper body. worse and sharp while doing activities such as standing up from a seated position or lifting the knee towards the chest during stair climbing. The human body has two sacroiliac joints, one on the left and one on the right, that often match each other but are highly variable from person to person cf0b1aa179
