The liberals drafted and ratified the Constitution of 1857, which enshrined rights such as universal male suffrage and eliminated Church and military privileges. The overthrow of Santa Anna, however, led to widespread dissatisfaction among conservative Mexicans and led to a twenty-two-year conflict and two wars between conservatives and liberals. In 1862, on the invitation of Mexican conservatives, Maximilian Habsburg was crowned Emperor of Mexico after a successful French invasion of the country. 082d4572ed == History == 082d4572ed

Morelia It is tradition to name people born on September 30 after the city. In 1580, this rivalry ended in Valladolid's favor, and it became the capital of the viceregal province. " Morelia (Spanish pronunciation: [mo'relja]; from 1545 to 1828 known as Valladolid; Otomi: Mānxuni) is the capital and most populous city of the Mexican state of Michoacán. Situated in the Guayangareo Valley in the north-central part of the state, it is the municipal seat of the municipality of Morelia. The main pre-Hispanic cultures here were the Purépecha and the Matlatzinca, but no major cities were founded in the valley during this time. The Spanish took control of the area in the 1520s. In 1991, the city was declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site for its well-preserved historical buildings and layout of the historic center. After the Mexican War of Independence, the city was renamed Morelia in honor of José María Morelos, who hailed from the city. Marquessate of the Valley of Oaxaca It was granted to Don Hernán Cortés, conquistador who led the conquest of the Aztec Empire, by Charles V, Holy Roman Emperor in 1529. The title was held by Cortés's descendants through 1814, when the Constitución de Apatzingan abolished hereditary titles in Mexico. Despite its name, the marquessate covered a much larger area than the Oaxaca Valley, comprising a vast stretch of land in the present-day Mexican states of Oaxaca, Morelos, Veracruz, Michoacán and Mexico. == Background == Judges of the SCJN are elected for 12 years. Each branch of the federal government establishes an evaluation committee which chooses the candidates that will run for a seat in the Supreme Court. Constitutional Elements (Mexico) They are considered the direct antecedent and source of creation of the Sentimientos de la Nación of José María Morelos and, therefore, of the subsequent Constitution of 1824. final draft of the Sentimientos de la Nación of 1813, to later be included in the Constitution of Apatzingán of 1814, in which Rayón would also participate The Constitutional Elements (Spanish: Elementos Constitucionales) were a set of guidelines in the form of a draft constitution for Mexico (then still the Viceroyalty of New Spain), written in April 1812, during the Mexican War of Independence by General Ignacio López Rayón, and circulated on September 4, 1812, in Zinacantepec, State of Mexico, with the purpose of constituting a nation independent from Spain. Therefore, it is the oldest antecedent of Mexican constitutionalism

Constitution of Apatzingán The Constitution of Apatzingán (Spanish: Constitución de Apatzingán), formally the Constitutional Decree for the Liberty of Mexican America (Spanish: The Constitution of Apatzingán (Spanish: Constitución de Apatzingán), formally the Constitutional Decree for the Liberty of Mexican America (Spanish: Decreto Constitucional para la Libertad de la América Mexicana), was promulgated on 22 October 1814 by the Congress of Anáhuac gathered in the city of Apatzingán because of the persecution of the troops of Félix María Calleja. The constitution was valid for insurgent forces in the territories that it controlled during the Mexican War of Independence

Six federal police officers were charged with murder on August 21, 2019 for their supposed involvement in a police operation that left nine dead on January 6, 2015 in Apatzingán. At least nine people died and several were injured when police fired against members and sympathizers of self-defense groups who had taken over the municipal palace. In 1813, Morelos wrote Sentimientos de la Nación, a document influenced by the Constitution of Cádiz where he outlined his program for the Mexican nation. Under his leadership,

the Congress of Anáhuac was installed in Chilpancingo, and on 6 November 1813 declared the independence of Mexico. On 22...

The tide of war The First Mexican Republic, known also as the First Federal Republic (Spanish: Primera República Federal), existed from 1824 to 1835. The First Republic was plagued through its entire twelve-year existence by severe financial and political instability. Political controversies, ever since the drafting of the constitution tended to center around whether Mexico should be a federal or a centralist state, with wider liberal and conservative causes attaching themselves to each faction... 082d4572ed Once the struggle for independence began, and given the power vacuum left by Ferdinand VII when he was deposed by Napoleon Bonaparte in 1808, it was in the interest of the insurgents to try to base their struggle for independence from the Viceroyalty of New Spain on legal principles that would legitimize their actions and serve as a basis for uniting the people around common ideals. 082d4572ed == History == 082d4572ed From 1876 to 1911, regular elections were held, but the electorate remained politically... 082d4572ed

Born in Valladolid, Michoacán, Morelos studied at Colegio de San Nicolás and was appointed priest of Carácuaro in 1799. He joined Miguel Hidalgo's Cry of Dolores, soon becoming an insurgency leader. Aided by local peoples, along with revolutionary leaders Mariano Matamoros and Ignacio López Rayón, Morelos occupied territories in southern and central New Spain, leading the Siege of Cuautla and capturing Acapulco, New Spain's main port in the Pacific Ocean. His campaigns galvanized regional insurgencies against Spanish rule, which made him the royalist army's main rival. 082d4572ed After the death of the Roman Catholic priest and revolutionary leader, Miguel Hidalgo y Costilla, on 28 June 1813, José María Morelos from Acapulco made a call to create a Congress in September in the city of Chilpancingo (now in the state of Guerrero), whose purpose was to create an independent government. Proclaimed as the Supreme National Congress, it was convened on 14 September 1813; that same day Morelos announced to the Assembly a program called Sentimientos de la Nación, in which the independence of Mexican America was declared and a government of popular representation

with division of powers, prohibition of slavery and absence of castes was instituted. On 6 November... After the 12th Marquess died in 1859, his successors as Duke of Monteleone appear to have not renewed this title until 1916, when the 16th Duke of Monteleone became the 13th Marquess of the valley of Oaxaca. The title again became dormant on his death in 1938. A member of a cadet branch of the family (descendant of the 7th Marchioness) asked for the resumption of the title in 1973, and it was granted to him. The descendants of the 13th Marquess, a family established in Italy, has claimed the title, but has not taken any legal action in Spain... There is another version, spread by writer Arturo Ortega Morán, in the sense that the deceased Nahuatl speaker Juan Luna Cárdenas pointed out that the word México comes from the nahuatl word Metzico, and the meaning of the latter is: "The place of the Metzicah, the followers of Metzitli, those who entrusted themselves to the moon." The republic was proclaimed on 1 November 1823 by the Supreme Executive Power, months after the fall of the Mexican Empire ruled by emperor Agustín I, a former royalist military officer-turned-insurgent for independence. The federation was formally and legally established on 4 October 1824, when the Federal Constitution of the United Mexican States came into force.

Democracy in Mexico Three years later, a federal republic was created under the Constitution of 1824. After a long history under the Spanish Empire (1521–1821), Mexico gained its independence in 1821 and became the First Mexican Empire led by royalist military officer Agustín de Iturbide. Santa Anna held immense sway over the fledgling Mexican democracy until 1855, when he was ousted by liberal politicians. Name of Mexico revolutionary forces that met at Apatzingán (in today's state of Michoacán) drafted the first constitution, in 1814 whereby the name América Mexicana Several hypotheses seek to explain the etymology of the name "Mexico" (México in modern Spanish) which dates, at least, back to 14th century Mesoamerica. Presently, there is still no consensus among experts. Among these are expressions in the Nahuatl language such as (in translation), Mexitli ("place in the middle of the century plant") and Mēxihco ("place in the navel of the moon"), along with the currently used shortened form in Spanish, "el ombligo de la luna" ("belly button of the moon"), used in both 21st century speech and literature

As far back as 1590, the "Orbis Terrarum Typus De Integro Multis in Locis Emendatus" of Petrus Planicus showed that the northern part of the New World was known as "America Mexicana" (Mexican America), as Mexico City was the seat for the New Spain viceroyalty.

"New Spain" was not the old name for Mexico, but was in actuality... 082d4572ed Mexico's Constitution of Apatzingán was signed in the city in 1814, during the Mexican War of Independence in the Viceroyalty of New Spain against the Spanish Empire. 082d4572ed
