

What Are Olfactory Indicators

The first experiments to measure intracellular calcium levels via protein expression were based on aequorin, a bioluminescent protein from the jellyfish *Aequorea*. To produce light, however, this enzyme needs the 'fuel' compound coelenterazine, which has to be added to the preparation. This is not practical in intact animals, and in addition, the temporal resolution of bioluminescence imaging is relatively poor (seconds-minutes)....

Body odour affects sexual attraction in several ways, including through human biology, the menstrual cycle and fluctuating asymmetry. The olfactory membrane plays a role in smelling and subconsciously assessing another human's pheromones. It affects the sexual attraction of insects and mammals. The major histocompatibility complex genes are important for the immune system, and appear to play a role in sexual attraction via body odour. Studies have shown that body odour is strongly connected with attraction in heterosexual females. The women in one study ranked body odour as more important for attraction than "looks". Humans may not simply depend on visual and verbal senses to be attracted to a possible partner/mate.

Sexual stimulation is a broad term, usually understood to mean physical touching of the genitals or other body parts. The term can, however, include stimuli affecting the mind (sexual fantasy), or senses other than touch (such as sight, smell, or hearing). Sufficient physical stimulation of the genitals usually results in an orgasm. Stimulation can be by oneself (masturbation or sexual fantasy) or by a sexual partner (sexual intercourse or other sexual activity), by use of objects or tools, or by some combination of these methods.

Behavioral enrichment Each of the techniques used is intended to stimulate the animal's senses similarly to how they would be activated in the wild. In addition to those listed above, behavioral indicators include the occurrence of abnormal Behavioral enrichment is an animal husbandry principle that seeks to enhance the quality of captive animal care by identifying and providing the environmental stimuli necessary for optimal psychological and physiological well-being. A variety of enrichment techniques are used to create desired outcomes similar to an animal's individual and species' history. of behavioral and physiological indicators of animal welfare. Enrichment can either be active or passive, depending on whether it requires direct contact between the animal and the enrichment. Provided enrichment may be seen in the form of auditory, olfactory, habitat factors, food, research projects, training, and objects

The use of optogenetic sensors is not restricted to neuroscience, but plays increasingly important roles in immunology, cardiology and cancer research. Genetically encoded calcium indicators (GECIs) are used frequently to monitor neuronal activity, but other cellular parameters such as membrane voltage or second messenger activity can also be recorded optically. g. channelrhodopsins. In a broader sense, optogenetic approaches also include the use of genetically encoded biosensors to monitor the activity of neurons or other cell types by measuring fluorescence or bioluminescence, although these techniques substantially predated the first use of the term optogenetics

Olfactory memory Explicit memory is typically the form focused on in the studies of olfactory memory, though implicit forms of memory certainly supply distinct contributions to the understanding of odors and memories of them. The body odor of human males plays an important role in human sexual attraction as a powerful indicator of genetic variation (MHC/HLA heterozygosity); significant evidence suggests that women are attracted to men whose body odor is different from theirs, indicating that they have immune genes that are different from their own, which may produce healthier offspring

Aroma of wine The human tongue is limited to the primary tastes perceived by taste receptors on the tongue – sourness, bitterness, saltiness, sweetness and savouriness. Different terms are used to describe what is being smelled. In wine tasting, wine is sometimes smelled before taking a sip in order to identify some components of the wine that may be present. The term aroma may be further distinguished from bouquet which generally refers to the smells that arise from the chemical reactions of fermentation and aging of the wine. In wine tasting, wine is sometimes smelled The aromas of wine are more diverse than its flavours. The wide array of fruit, earthy, leathery, floral, herbal, mineral, and woody flavour present in wine are derived from aroma notes sensed by the olfactory bulb.
