== Background == The plant is also known as hemp, although this term is usually used to refer only to varieties cultivated for non-drug use. Industrial hemp textile products are made from cannabis plants selected to produce an abundance of fibre.

Rye may have been cultivated earlier, but this claim remains controversial. Regardless, rye's spread from Southwest Asia to the Atlantic was independent of the Neolithic founder crop package.
