Hirschsprung's disease Children who do not respond to constipation treatment for six months should also raise Hirschsprung's disease (HD or HSCR) is a birth defect in which nerves are missing from parts of the intestine. However, others may be diagnosed later in infancy or early childhood. The most prominent symptom is constipation. Other symptoms may include vomiting, abdominal pain, diarrhea and slow growth. About half of all children with Hirschsprung's disease are diagnosed in the first year of life. Complications may include enterocolitis, megacolon, bowel obstruction and intestinal perforation. Opium's main psychoactive alkaloids, primarily morphine, act on  $\mu$ -opioid receptors, causing analgesia, with long-term use leading to tolerance and dependence. ways, including inhalation of vapors, suppositories, medical poultices, and as a combination with hemlock for suicide. Approximately 12 percent of opium is made up of the analgesic alkaloid morphine, which is processed chemically to produce heroin and other synthetic opioids for medicinal use and for the illegal drug trade. The traditional, labor-intensive method of obtaining the latex is to scratch ("score") the immature seed pods (fruits) by hand; The latex leaks out and dries to a sticky yellowish residue that is later scraped off and dehydrated. Common side effects of promethazine include confusion and sleepiness; consumption of alcohol or other sedatives can make these symptoms worse. It is unclear if use of promethazine during pregnancy or breastfeeding is safe. Use of promethazine is not recommended in those less than two years old, due to potentially negative effects on breathing. Use of promethazine by injection into a vein is not recommended, due to potential skin damage. Promethazine is in the phenothiazine family of medications. It is also a strong anticholinergic and at high or toxic doses can act as a deliriant.

Endo responded by voluntarily removing Opana ER from the market a month later.
