Rheumatic fever Rheumatic fever may occur following an infection of the throat by the bacterium *Streptococcus pyogenes*. The disease typically develops two to four weeks after a streptococcal throat infection. If the Rheumatic fever (RF) is an inflammatory disease that can involve the heart, joints, skin, and brain. The heart is involved in about half of cases. Damage to the heart valves, known as rheumatic heart disease (RHD), usually occurs after repeated attacks but can sometimes occur after one. The damaged valves may result in heart failure, atrial fibrillation and infection of the valves. Dick studied scarlet fever whilst serving the Army Medical Corps during World War I. Dick continued with his research into scarlet fever following the war, and in 1923, in collaboration with his wife Gladys Rowena Dick, managed to locate the cause of the disease in a toxin produced by a strain of Streptococcus bacteria. Using this, they were able to create an antitoxin for treatment and a non-toxic vaccine for immunization. In 1933, Dick and his wife were awarded the Cameron Prize for Therapeutics of the University of Edinburgh. 0663f29a38 == Early life and education == 0663f29a38 There were 3,729 notifications of iGAS recorded in England between 12 September 2022 and 18 June 2023. In the UK, 516 deaths from iGAS have been recorded, of which 61 were children, 52 in England, five in Wales, three in Scotland, and one in Northern Ireland. The term was coined in 1877 by Viennese surgeon Albert Theodor Billroth (1829-1894), from Ancient Greek στρεπτός (*streptós*), meaning "twisted", and κόκκος (*kókkos*), meaning "grain". In 1984, many bacteria formerly grouped in the genus *Streptococcus* were separated out into the genera *Enterococcus* and *Lactococcus*. Moser at first used scarlet fever serum primarily on the most severely sick persons. After achieving positive results it was applied in the first or second day following contraction of scarlet fever. In many cases the children treated demonstrated great improvement in a very short time, with their fevers going away quickly. Moser worked with four hundred children suffering from scarlatina at St. Anne's Hospital. The mortality rate of those he treated was 8.9%. This compared quite favorably when measured against the 13.09% among children in Vienna hospitals where the 0663f29a38 Dochez was born in San Francisco to Louis and Josephine Dietrich Dochez. His family is of Belgian descent. Dochez moved to Indianapolis as a young child, then later to Harford County, Maryland. His parents operated a farm,

Streptococcus pyogenes is the predominant species harboring the Lancefield group A antigen, and is often called group A *Streptococcus* (GAS). The name group A (beta-hemolytic) *Streptococcus* is thus also used. These bacteria are extracellular, and made up of non-motile and non-sporing cocci (round cells) that tend to link in chains. Scarlet fever develops in a small number of people who have strep throat or streptococcal skin infections. The bacteria are usually spread by people coughing or sneezing. It can also be spread when a person touches an object that has the bacteria on it and then touches their mouth or nose. The diagnosis is typically confirmed by culturing swabs of the throat.
