Viral diseases of potato However, potato virus X (PVX), potato virus Y (PVY), and potato leafroll virus (PLRV) are the most important viruses worldwide. Such is the case of potato virus M (PVM) in some Asian and

European countries. Some others are of economic importance only in some regions. About 28 viruses have been reported infecting potato crops. diseases of potato are a group of diseases caused by different types of Viruses that affect potato crops worldwide and, although they do not affect human or animal health since they are viruses that only infect vegetables, they are a source of great economic losses annually

The main role of potassium is to provide the ionic environment for metabolic processes in the cytosol, and as such functions as a regulator of various processes including growth regulation. Plants require potassium ions (K+) for protein synthesis and for the opening and closing of stomata, which is regulated by proton pumps to make surrounding guard cells either turgid or flaccid. A deficiency of potassium ions can impair a plant's ability to maintain these processes. Potassium also functions in other physiological processes such as photosynthesis, protein synthesis, activation of some enzymes, phloem solute transport of photoassimilates into source organs, and maintenance of cation:anion balance in the cytosol and vacuole.

Potassium deficiency (plants) Potassium deficiency causes brown scorching and curling of leaf tips, as well as chlorosis (yellowing) between leaf veins. The leaves of the plant appear dull and are often blue-green in color with interveinal Potassium deficiency, also known as potash deficiency, is a plant disorder caused by the depletion of potassium ions (K+) in the soil. as follows: In potatoes, tuber size is much reduced and crop yield is low. It is most common in light, sandy soils with a low clay content, as potassium is highly soluble and will easily leach from soils that lack colloids

An additional problem is the co-infection of two or more viruses on the same plants.
