Released on 23 June 1983 in the United Kingdom, *The Meaning of Life* was not as acclaimed as its predecessors, but was still well received critically and was a minor box office success; the film grossed almost \$43 million against a \$9 million budget. It was screened at the 1983 Cannes Film Festival, where it won the Grand Prix. The film appears in a 2010 list of the top 20 cult films published in *The Boston Globe*.
The most common form, 'What does that have to do with the price of tea in China?', is a retort to an irrelevant suggestion. This facetious usage implies that the topic under discussion might as well be the price of tea in China for all the relevance the speaker's suggestion bears on it.
Originally an "anti-hit" produced to promote the duo's new season of Norwegian television talk show *I kveld med YLVIS* ('Tonight with Ylvis'), it was uploaded to YouTube as a teaser. Intended, for comedic purposes, to be a "flop", "The Fox" unexpectedly went viral, becoming Ylvis' "breakout" song and drawing international attention to the group. In 2013, Ylvis stated there were no plans to release an album including the song or any sequel to it.

The plain meaning rule dictates that statutes are to be interpreted using the ordinary meaning of the language of the statute.
