It produces the highest rice yields in Asia, at 6.5 metric tons per hectare (2.6 long ton/acre; 2.9 short ton/acre). Rice is produced throughout the nation and is believed to have been first domesticated in the surrounding regions of the Yangtze River and the Yunnan-Guizhou highlands of Southern China. Rice is believed to have been first cultivated around the Yangtze River Valley and Yellow River 11,000 years ago, and found upon clustering in the middle of the Yangtze River in the provinces of Hubei and Hunan in central China according to archaeological records. Rice production in China uses techniques, such as turning soil into mud to prevent water loss, as well as seed transplantation. Hazards associated with rice consumption include arsenic from the soil, and *Bacillus cereus* which can grow in poorly-stored cooked rice, and cause food poisoning. Rice may vary in genetics, grain length, color, thickness, stickiness, aroma, growing method, and other characteristics, leading to many cultivars. For instance, over nine major rice cultivars exist to make sake alone. The two subspecies of Asian rice, *indica* and *japonica*, can generally be distinguished by length and stickiness. *Indica* rice is long-grained and unsticky, while *japonica* is short-grained and glutinous. John Bachman discovered the marsh rice rat in 1816, and it was formally described in 1837. Several subspecies have been described since the 1890s, mainly from Florida, but disagreement exists over their validity. The Florida Keys population is sometimes classified as a different species, the silver rice rat (*O. argentatus*). The adult moth is characterized by its vibrant yellow or straw coloration, with distinct wavy lines visible on its forewings and hindwings. Eggs are usually laid individually or in groups on the undersides of leaves, appearing scaly and white. A female moth can lay around 56 eggs, with an incubation period lasting between 4 and 8 days. Larvae go through 5 to 6 instars over a period of approximately 22 to 23 days before pupating within folded leaves for about 6 to 7 days. Fully grown caterpillars are green and measure around 16.5 millimeters in length. The entire life cycle of this moth spans about 5 weeks. 3edeabcc2

Medium-grain rice is high in amylopectin and becomes more sticky. Medium-grain rice is used for sweet dishes, for risotto in Italy, and many rice dishes, such as *arròs negre*, in Spain. Short-grain rice is stickier and allows the rice to hold its shape when cooked. Short-grain rice is used extensively in Japan, including sushi and to accompany savoury dishes.
