List of English words without rhymes The word "rhyme" here is used in the strict sense, called a perfect rhyme, that the words are pronounced the same from the vowel of the main stressed syllable onwards. Only the list of one-syllable words can hope to be anything near complete; there are many disyllabic or polysyllabic words without rhymes. The list was compiled from the point of view of Received Pronunciation (with a few exceptions for General American), and may not work for other accents or dialects.
