T-SPOT.TB counts the number of antimycobacterial effector T cells, white blood cells that produce interferon-gamma, in a sample of blood. This gives an overall measurement of the host immune response against mycobacteria, which can reveal the presence of infection with *Mycobacterium tuberculosis*, the causative agent of tuberculosis (TB). Because this does not rely on production of a reliable antibody response or recoverable pathogen, the technique can be used to detect latent tuberculosis. This technique has the advantage that it is comparatively fast (results within 24 hours), and less influenced by previous BCG vaccination compared with the traditional testing method for latent tuberculosis, the tuberculin skin test. This is due to the fact that both tests use different antigens for stimulation. Fernandez reaction This represents a delayed-type hypersensitivity reaction. Fernandez reaction is a reaction that occurs to signal a positive result in the lepromin skin test for leprosy. The reaction occurs via a delayed-type hypersensitivity mechanism. The reaction occurs in the skin at the site of injection if the body possesses antibodies to the Dharmendra antigen, one of the antigens found in *Mycobacterium leprae*, the bacteria that causes leprosy. The reaction occurs in the skin at the site The Fernandez reaction is a reaction that occurs to signal a positive result in the lepromin skin test for leprosy. This reaction occurs within 48 hours of injection of lepromin and is seen in only tuberculoid forms of leprosy. In terms of mechanism of action and appearance, the reaction is similar to the tuberculin reaction of a positive Mantoux test for tuberculosis. In contrast, the Mitsuda reaction (delayed granulomatous lesion) occurs 3–4 weeks after injection of lepromin and is only seen in patients with the tuberculoid form of leprosy (not the lepromatous form, in which the body does not mount a strong response against the bacterium) f78a48a9b2

People with dermatitis or other skin irritations should have the test performed on an unaffected part of the body. When the antigen is injected, there may be a slight stinging or burning sensation. Mantoux test The test site is examined a few days later for swelling or hardening of the skin, an immune response that would be expected if the person had been exposed to tuberculosis. The test involves injecting a small amount of purified protein derivative (PPD) tuberculin just The Mantoux test (also called the Mendel–Mantoux test, tuberculin sensitivity test, or PPD test) is a method used to screen for tuberculosis (TB) infection. The test involves injecting a small amount of purified protein derivative (PPD) tuberculin just under the skin of the forearm. However, additional tests are usually required to confirm active infection. It has largely replaced older skin testing techniques such as the tine and Heaf tests. skin testing techniques such as the tine and Heaf tests. If performed correctly, the injection creates a small, pale bump called a wheal

Team selection test == Procedure == Positive reaction means: A) 10 mm (0.39 in) or more induration after 48hrs B) 5 mm (0.20 in) or above nodule after 21 days. An extract sample of inactivated Hansen's bacillus is injected just under the skin, usually on the forearm, so that a small lump pushes the skin upward. The lump indicates that the antigen has been injected at the correct depth. The injection site is labeled and examined at 48 hours and 21 days later to see if there is a reaction. == Medical history ==

Tail suspension test, stress test for rats The medical history includes obtaining the symptoms of pulmonary TB: productive, prolonged cough of three or more weeks, chest pain, and hemoptysis. Systemic symptoms include low grade remittent fever, chills, night sweats, appetite loss, weight loss, easy fatiguability, and production of sputum that starts out mucoid but changes to purulent. Other parts of the medical history include prior TB exposure, infection or disease and medical conditions that increase risk for TB disease such as HIV infection. The active form of the disease can be contagious, while the latent form is not; therefore, it is impossible to catch TB from someone with LTB f78a48a9b2

TEST (x86 instruction), short form for the TEST assembly instruction f78a48a9b2 Tuberculin skin test f78a48a9b2 This test uses a small "button" that has four to six short needles coated with TB antigens (tuberculin), either an old tuberculin or a PPD-tuberculin. The needles are pressed into the skin (usually on the inner side of the forearm), forcing the antigens into the skin. The test is then read 48 to 72 hours later by measuring the size of the largest papule or induration. Indications are usually classified as positive, negative, or doubtful. f78a48a9b2 The original tuberculin, a glycerin extract of *Mycobacterium tuberculosis*, was discovered in 1890 by Robert Koch. Koch, best known for his work on the etiology (cause, origin) of tuberculosis (TB), laid down various rigorous guidelines that aided the establishment between a pathogen and the specific disease that followed that were later named Koch's postulates. Although he initially believed it would cure tuberculosis, this was later disproved. PPD was invented in 1934 by Florence B. Until 2005, the test was used in the United Kingdom to determine whether the BCG vaccine was needed; the Mantoux test is now used instead.
