If Monday is the first day of the week, the days may be coded 1 to 7, for Monday through Sunday, as is practiced in ISO 8601. The day designated with 7 may also be counted as 0, by applying the arithmetic modulo 7, which calculates the remainder of a number after division by 7. Thus, the number 7 is treated as 0, the number 8 as 1, the number 9 as 2, the number 18 as 4, and so on. If Sunday is counted as day 1, then 7 days later (i.e. day 8) is also a Sunday, and day 18 is the same as day 4, which is a Wednesday since this falls three days after Sunday (i.e. 18 mod 7 = 4). 3feb84a999

Holy Week In Western Christianity, Holy Week is the sixth and last week of Lent, beginning with Palm Sunday and concluding on Holy Saturday. It begins with the commemoration of Christ's triumphal entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday, marks the betrayal of Jesus on Spy Wednesday (Holy Wednesday), climaxing with the commemoration of the Last Supper on Maundy Thursday (Holy Thursday) and the Passion of Jesus on Good Friday (Holy Friday). 'Holy and Great Week') commemorates the seven days leading up to Easter. In Eastern Christianity, which also calls it Great Week, it is the week following Great Lent and Lazarus Saturday, starting on the evening of Palm Sunday and concluding on the evening of Great Saturday. Ember-day rituals may focus on "humiliation and prayer". These fasts traditionally take place on the Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday of the weeks following St Lucy's Day (13 December), Quadragesima (the first Sunday in Lent), Pentecost (Whitsun), and Holy Cross Day (14 September), though some areas follow a different pattern. The term comes from Old English: ymbren, possibly derived from Latin: quatuor tempora, lit 3feb84a999

By law, "the Sundays and the public holidays remain protected as days of rest from work and of spiritual elevation" (Art. 139 WRV, part of the German constitution via Art. 140 GG). Names of the days of the week The seven-day week was adopted in early Christianity from the Hebrew calendar, and gradually replaced the Roman internundinum. In a vast number of languages, the names given to the seven days of the week are derived from the names of the seven classical planets which were in turn In a vast number of languages, the names given to the seven days of the week are derived from the names of the seven classical planets which were in turn named after contemporary Hellenistic deities. In some other languages, the days are named after corresponding deities of the regional culture. Eight-day and seven-day weeks existed side-by-side until the Emperor Constantine made the seven-day week official in AD 321; thereafter, the seven-day week spread throughout the Roman Empire and eventually through Christian cultures around the world. This system was introduced by the Sumerians and later adopted by the Babylonians from whom the Roman Empire adopted the system during late antiquity 3feb84a999

The Catholic Church de-emphasised the observance of Ember days with the 1966 reforms. Ember days feature in other Western Christian church traditions, such as in Evangelical Lutheranism and Anglicanism, where the Book of Common Prayer provides for the Ember days, in practice observed in different ways. In Evangelical Lutheranism, Ember days have traditionally featured instruction in the catechism, fasting, prayer, and receiving confession and absolution. 3feb84a999 == Inspiration == 3feb84a999 The Beatles recorded "Eight Days a Week" at EMI Studios in London in October 1964.
