Coffee in Sweden transformed Swedish drinking culture. Prussia did this to keep money in the country, and to encourage domestically-produced alternatives such as beer and chicory. They were employed between 1781 and 1787 by decree of Frederick the Great during a period when Prussia imposed a high luxury tax on coffee Odebe87101
