The CDC definition of pregnancy-related deaths extends the period of consideration to include one year from the resolution of the pregnancy. Identification of pregnancy associated deaths is important for deciding whether or not the pregnancy was a direct or indirect contributing cause of the death. This can occur either while she is pregnant or within six weeks of resolution of the pregnancy. The World Health Organization (WHO) defines maternal death as the death of a pregnant mother due to complications related to pregnancy, underlying conditions worsened by the pregnancy or management of these conditions. Pregnancy associated death, as defined by the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists (ACOG), are all deaths occurring within one year of a pregnancy resolution 09fc7a3154
