

# Eye Surgery For Myopia

The retina is a thin layer at the back of the eye that processes visual information and sends it to the brain. When the retina detaches, common symptoms in the affected eye include seeing floaters, flashing lights, and/or a dark shadow, as well as sudden blurry vision. LASIK LASIK surgery is LASIK or Lasik (; "laser-assisted in situ keratomileusis"), commonly referred to as laser eye surgery or laser vision correction, is a type of refractive surgery for the correction of myopia, hypermetropia, and astigmatism. eye surgery or laser vision correction, is a type of refractive surgery for the correction of myopia, hypermetropia, and astigmatism. LASIK surgery is performed by an ophthalmologist who uses a femtosecond laser or a microkeratome to create a corneal flap to expose the corneal stroma and then an excimer laser to reshape the corneal stroma in order to improve visual acuity 1bb26fa777

Surface anaesthesia is given by instillation of 2.5 ml xylocaine. One drop of xylocaine instilled four times after every 4 minutes will produce conjunctival and corneal anaesthesia. Paracaine, tetracaine, bupivacaine, lidocaine etc. may also be used in place of xylocaine. Cataract surgery by phacoemulsification is frequently performed under surface anaesthesia. Facial nerve, which supplies the orbicularis oculi muscle, is blocked in addition for intraocular surgeries. Refractive error this is called myopia or nearsightedness. Other symptoms may include double vision, headaches, and eye strain. People with myopia typically have blurry vision when viewing distant objects because the eye is refracting more Refractive error is a problem with focusing light accurately on the retina due to the shape of the eye and/or cornea. Near-sightedness results in far away objects being blurry, far-sightedness and presbyopia result in close objects being blurry, and astigmatism causes objects to appear stretched out or blurry. The most common types of refractive error are near-sightedness, far-sightedness, astigmatism, and presbyopia 1bb26fa777

There may also be changes in the fundus, including posterior staphyloma, caused by the eye growing posteriorly and losing its spherical shape. Since enlargement of the eye does not progress at a uniform rate, abnormal protrusions of uveal tissue may occur through weak points in the eye. LASIK is very similar to another surgical corrective procedure, photorefractive keratectomy (PRK), and LASEK. All represent advances over radial keratotomy in the surgical treatment of refractive errors of vision. Myopia can be corrected with eyeglasses, contact lenses, or by refractive surgery. Eyeglasses are the simplest and safest method of correction. Contact lenses can provide a relatively wider corrected field of vision, but are associated with an increased risk of infection. Refractive surgeries such as LASIK and PRK permanently change the shape of the cornea. An IOL (intraocular lens) is usually implanted in its place (PCIOL), or less frequently in the ciliary sulcus, to restore clear vision. Cataract surgery is performed by an ophthalmologist in an out-patient setting at a surgical centre or hospital. Local anaesthesia (injection) or topical anesthesia (drops) are normally used. The procedure is usually quick and causes little or no pain and minor discomfort.
