Druze in Israel They preserve the Arabic language and culture as central components of their identity, and Arabic remains their primary language. Survey data indicates that roughly 70% of Druze identify as ethnically Arab, and that Israeli Druze prioritize their identity first as Druze, second as Arab, and third as Israeli. The majority of Israeli Druze are concentrated in northern Israel, especially in Galilee, Carmel and the Golan areas. At the end of 2022, there were 150,000 Druze people living within Israel, representing a ten-fold increase since 1948. During the Iron Age II period, two Israelite kingdoms emerged, covering much of Canaan: the Kingdom of Israel in the north and the Kingdom of Judah in the south.
