In particular, burping by domesticated ruminants, such as cows or sheep, is a major contributor of methane emissions and may have a negative effect on the environment. Significant... f27e007169 Serious and relatively common causes include acute coronary syndrome such as a heart attack (31%), pulmonary embolism (2%), pneumothorax, pericarditis (4%), aortic dissection (1%) and esophageal rupture. Other common causes include gastroesophageal reflux disease (30%), muscle or skeletal pain (28%), pneumonia (2%), shingles (0.5%), pleuritis, traumatic and anxiety disorders. Determining the cause of chest pain is based on a person's medical history, a physical exam and other medical tests. About 3% of heart attacks, however, are initially missed. f27e007169 Symptoms include nausea, vomiting, abdominal pain, feeling full soon after beginning to eat (early satiety), abdominal bloating, and heartburn. Many or most cases are idiopathic. The most commonly known cause is autonomic neuropathy of the vagus nerve, which innervates the stomach. Uncontrolled diabetes mellitus is a frequent cause of this nerve damage, but trauma to the vagus nerve is also possible. Some cases may be considered post-infectious. f27e007169 The most common symptom associated with bloating is a sensation that the abdomen is full or distended. Heartburn It is a symptom that is commonly linked to acid reflux and is often triggered by food. Causes include acid reflux, gastroesophageal reflux disease (GERD), damage to the esophageal lining, bile acid, mechanical stimulation to the esophagus, and esophageal hypersensitivity. Heartburn affects 25% of the population at least once a month. Lying down, bending, lifting, and performing certain exercises can exacerbate heartburn. It is sometimes referred to as indigestion, sour stomach, acid regurgitation, or bitter belching. Heartburn is considered troublesome if mild symptoms Heartburn is a burning sensation felt behind the breastbone f27e007169

Common causes include infection with *Helicobacter pylori* and excessive use of non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drugs (NSAIDs). Other, less common causes include tobacco smoking, physiological stress, Behçet's disease, Zollinger-Ellison syndrome, Crohn's disease, and liver cirrhosis. Chest pain Those with diabetes or the elderly may have less clear symptoms. Associated symptoms may include pain in the shoulder, arm, upper abdomen, or jaw, along with nausea, sweating, or shortness of breath. It may be described as sharp, dull, pressure, heaviness or squeezing. It can be divided into heart-related and non-heart-related pain. Pain due to insufficient blood flow to the heart is also called angina pectoris. Symptoms include epigastric pain or burning, postprandial fullness, early satiety, bloating, nausea, and belching; notably, chest pain can also manifest, potentially Chest pain is pain or

In humans, belching can be caused by normal eating processes, or as a side effect of other medical conditions. When belching is excessive, it may be classed as a belching disorder, one of the gastroduodenal disorders. Gastroparesis The opposite of this, where stomach contents exit quickly into the duodenum, is called dumping syndrome. Complications of achlorhydria most frequently include small intestinal bacterial overgrowth and the nutritional deficiencies that can result from it. Rarely, achlorhydria may contribute to formation of gastric cancers or gastric carcinoid tumors. f27e007169

Gastritis Other symptoms include nausea and vomiting, bloating, indigestion, loss of appetite and heartburn. Complications may include stomach bleeding, stomach ulcers, and stomach tumors. Autoimmune atrophic gastritis may lead to issues including pernicious anemia. There is a range of levels of social acceptance for burping: within certain contexts and cultures, burping is acceptable. In some cultures and situations it may even be perceived as humorous, while in others it is seen as impolite or even offensive and therefore unacceptable. An infant often accumulates gas when feeding, and this needs to be vented by way of burping. To burp the baby is the common expression. f27e007169

Bloating during eating and drinking too quickly. In most cases it does not require serious medical attention or treatment. Bloating can affect anyone of any age range and is usually self-diagnosed. Bloating is generally characterized by an excess buildup of gas, air or fluids in the stomach. A person may have feelings of tightness, pressure or fullness in the stomach; it may or may not be accompanied by a visibly distended abdomen. Burping can also be used **Abdominal bloating** (or simply bloating) is a short-term disease that affects the gastrointestinal tract. Although the term bloating is usually used interchangeably with abdominal distension, these symptoms probably have different pathophysiological processes, which are not fully understood. As the stomach swells, belching removes the gas and alleviates the pain associated with it f27e007169

Endoscopy and esophageal pH monitoring can be used to evaluate heartburn. Some causes of heartburn, such as GERD, may be diagnosed based on symptoms alone. Potential differential diagnoses for heartburn include motility disorders, ulcers, inflammation of the esophagus, and medication side effects. Lifestyle changes, such as losing weight and avoiding fatty foods, can improve heartburn. Over-the-counter alginates or antacids can help with mild or occasional heartburn. Heartburn treatment primarily involves antisecretory medications like H₂ receptor antagonists (H₂RAs) and proton-pump inhibitors (PPIs). f27e007169 Management of chest pain is based on the underlying cause. Initial treatment often includes the medications aspirin and nitroglycerin. The response to... f27e007169 Diagnosis is via one or more of the following: barium swallow X-ray, barium beefsteak meal, radioisotope gastric-emptying scan, gastric manometry, esophagogastroduodenoscopy (EGD), and a stable isotope breath test. Endoscopy, a type of X-ray known as an upper gastrointestinal series, blood tests, and stool tests may help with diagnosis. Stomach cancer Early symptoms may include heartburn, upper abdominal pain, nausea, and loss of appetite. It is a cancer that develops in the lining of the stomach, caused by abnormal cell growth. Lymphomas and mesenchymal tumors may also develop in the stomach. Later signs Stomach cancer, also known as gastric cancer, is a malignant tumor of the stomach. Most cases of stomach cancers are gastric carcinomas, which can be divided into several subtypes, including gastric adenocarcinomas. and mesenchymal tumors may also develop in the stomach. Early symptoms may include heartburn, upper abdominal pain, nausea, and loss of appetite. The cancer may spread from the stomach to other parts of the body, particularly the liver, lungs, bones, lining of the abdomen, and lymph nodes. Peptic ulcer disease The most common symptoms of a duodenal ulcer are waking at night with upper abdominal pain, and upper abdominal pain that improves with eating. With a gastric ulcer, the pain may worsen with eating. About a third of older people with peptic ulcers have no symptoms. the stomach's gastric mucosa (lining of the stomach), the first part of the small intestine, or sometimes the lower esophagus. Other symptoms include belching, vomiting, weight loss, or poor appetite. An ulcer in the stomach is called a gastric ulcer, while one in the first part of the intestines is a duodenal ulcer. An ulcer in the stomach is Peptic ulcer disease refers to damage of the inner part of the stomach's gastric mucosa (lining of the stomach), the first part of the small intestine, or sometimes the lower esophagus. Bleeding occurs in as many as 15% of cases. The pain is often described as a burning or dull ache. Complications may include bleeding, perforation, and blockage of the stomach f27e007169

The bacterium *Helicobacter pylori* accounts for more than 60% of cases of stomach cancer. Certain strains of *H. pylori* have greater risks than others. Smoking, dietary factors such as pickled vegetables and obesity are other risk factors. About 10% of cases run in families, and between 1% and 3% of cases are due to genetic syndromes inherited such as hereditary diffuse gastric cancer. Achlorhydria Achlorhydria is commonly a complication of some other disease, such as chronic *Helicobacter pylori* infection or autoimmune pernicious anemia, as well as a possible side effect of long-term use of proton pump inhibitors. including constant belching, constipation, and abdominal pain. Bloating can also be caused by chronic conditions and in rare cases can be a reoccurring life-threatening problem. f27e007169 The first step for management is to find a treatment for the underlying causes that produce it through a detailed medical history and a physical examination. The discomfort can be alleviated by the use of certain drugs and dietary modifications. f27e007169 Irrespective of the cause, achlorhydria can result in known complications of bacterial overgrowth and intestinal metaplasia, and symptoms are often consistent with those diseases: f27e007169 Prevention involves avoidance of things which irritate the gut and which trigger symptoms, including alcohol, nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory drugs (NSAIDs), tobacco, and certain foods.
