== History == f59ba33433 The Billy was bred by Monsieur Gaston Hublot de Rivault Taco in the 19th century, and was named after his home, Château de Billy, in Poitou. The breed was created by combining the three original strains of the Poitevin: the Montemboeuf, Ceris and Larrye. While the extant Poitevin more-closely resembles the original, tricoloured Larrye line, de Rivault was more drawn to the paler

colours associated with the Montemboeuf and Ceris lines, and colouration was a key factor when selecting breeding stock. The pack was dispersed in 1927, with the breed almost facing extinction, and only two hounds survived World War II; however, de Rivault's son, Anthony, set about reviving the breed by judicious use of the Poitevin, the Porcelaine, and the Harrier. f59ba33433 According to BigThink, over 40% of the world's dog breeds come from the United Kingdom, France and Germany. It states: "Great Britain and France are the ground zero of dog fancying, with 57 registered breeds each. Germany is not far behind, with 47 breeds. These three countries alone represent more than 40% of all dog breeds recognized by the Fédération Cynologique Internationale." There are more than 400 extant modern dog breeds. f59ba33433 Brittany (administrative region), the present-day administrative region of Brittany, in France, which is smaller than the historical province of Brittany f59ba33433 The Poitevin is renowned for its speed, stamina, scenting abilities and melodious voice whilst hunting. Packs have been known to reach speeds of 56 kilometres per hour (35 mph) and to hunt for up to seven hours. In his book *La Vénérerie*, Pierre de Cossé Brissac, 12th Duke of Brissac said of the Poitevin "He is able to chase the quarry more than 7 hours. In appearance it looks like a mixture of a foxhound and a greyhound. The Poitevin typically stands 60 to 72 centimetres (24 to 28 in) at the withers and weighs 20.5 to 30.5 kilograms (45 to 67 lb). They have a flat, gently sloping skull; a long, narrow tapering muzzle; a slender, well-muscled neck; long, straight, heavily boned legs and a long tail. The
