Tangled Up in Blue The opening track of his 15th studio album *Blood on the Tracks* (1975), the song was released as the album's sole single and reached No. 31 on the *Billboard* Hot 100. Dylan has altered the lyrics in subsequent performances, changing the point of view and details in the song.

Blood on the Tracks Dylan has denied that the songs were autobiographical. It remains one of Dylan's best-selling studio releases, with Blood on the Tracks is the fifteenth studio album by the American singer-songwriter Bob Dylan, released on January 20, 1975, by Columbia Records. In December, shortly before Columbia was due to release the album, Dylan abruptly re-recorded much of the material in Sound 80 studio in Minneapolis. the UK Albums Chart; the single "Tangled Up in Blue" peaked at No. Dylan began recording the album at an A & R studio in New York City in September 1974. In late January, he finally premiered Renaldo and Clara, the part-fiction, part-concert film shot in the fall... 353d8aa7d4 The track, first recorded in September 1974, was re-recorded on December 30 at Sound 80 in Minneapolis, Minnesota. The new version was released on Blood on the Tracks on January 20, 1975. The song received widespread acclaim from music critics, with particular praise for the lyrics. Rolling Stone ranked it No. 68 on their list of the 500 Greatest Songs of All Time. A number of alternate versions have been released, including multiple studio out-takes on The Bootleg Series Vol. 14: More Blood, More Tracks (2014). Dylan has performed the song live more than 1,600 times. 353d8aa7d4 Blood on the Tracks initially received mixed reviews, but has since been acclaimed by critics and fans as one of Dylan's best albums; various publications have listed it as one of the greatest albums of all time. It was a commercial success, peaking at No. 1 on the Billboard 200 and No. 4 on the UK Albums Chart; the single "Tangled Up in Blue" peaked at No. 31 on the

Billboard Hot 100. It remains... Dylan has been the subject of 11 documentaries, starred in three theatrical films; appeared in other 36 films, documentaries, and home videos; and is the subject of the semi-biographical tribute films *I'm Not There* and *A Complete Unknown*. He has written and published lyrics, artwork, and memoirs in 11 books; three of his songs have been made into children's books. He has done numerous concert and media appearances, joined collaborative projects, and contributed to tribute albums.

== Background and recording == Dylan was born in St. Louis County, Minnesota. He moved to New York City in 1961 to pursue a music career. His 1962 debut album, *Bob Dylan*, containing traditional folk and blues material, was followed by his breakthrough album, *The Freewheelin' Bob Dylan* (1963), which included "Girl from the North Country" and "A Hard Rain's a-Gonna Fall", adapting older folk songs. His songs "Blowin' in the Wind" (1963) and "The Times They Are a-Changin'" (1964) became anthems for the civil rights and antiwar movements. Dylan created controversy when he used electrically amplified rock instrumentation for his albums *Bringing It All Back Home*, *Highway...*

Described as having beauty and gravitas, the song features a pop chord progression and has a riff and lyrical theme similar to "Stuck Inside of Mobile with the Memphis Blues Again". It has been anthologized on every reissue of *The Essential Bob Dylan* since 2010 and frequently places on critics' lists of Dylan's greatest songs. Like much of Dylan's 21st century output, "Mississippi" was produced by Dylan under the pseudonym Jack Frost.

A high-definition 5.1 surround sound edition of the album was released on SACD by Columbia in 2003.

Carter and John Artis had been charged with a triple murder at the Lafayette Grill in Paterson, New Jersey, in 1966. The following year Carter and Artis were found guilty of the murders, which were widely reported as racially motivated. In the years that followed, a substantial amount of controversy emerged over the case, ranging from allegations of faulty evidence and questionable eyewitness testimony to an unfair trial.

The album was generally well-reviewed by music critics, and the single "Gotta Serve Somebody" became his first hit in three years, winning Dylan the inaugural Grammy Award for Best Male Rock Vocal Performance in 1980. In his autobiography, Carter maintained his innocence and, after reading it, Dylan visited him in Rahway State Prison in Woodbridge Township, New Jersey. 353d8aa7d4 "Mississippi" was the last track recorded for Love and Theft, and according to drummer David Kemper, it was added almost as an afterthought.
