

Do Tomato Plants Need Full Sun

Hazard: Parts of plant are poisonous if ingested

Tomato plants are vines, largely annual, and vulnerable to frost, though sometimes living longer in greenhouses. The flowers can self-fertilize. Modern varieties have been bred to ripen uniformly red, in a process that has impaired the fruit's sweetness and flavor. There are thousands of cultivars, varying in size, color, shape, and flavor. Tomatoes are attacked by many insect pests and nematodes and are subject to diseases caused by viruses, mildew, and blight fungi.

Beet curly top virus causes curly top disease in beets and is carried by the beet leafhopper (*Circulifer tenellus*) throughout arid and semi-arid locations. The term curly top virus often refers to this specific virus. It can also cause curly top in tomatoes, beans, cucurbits, and other crops. This disease can be reduced if plants are planted in the shade because the beet leafhoppers and other insects like to feed on these plants in the sun.

In Spanish, it is called tomate de cáscara (husk tomato), tomate de fresadilla (little strawberry tomato), tomate milpero (field tomato), tomate verde (green tomato), tomatillo (Mexico; this term means "little tomato" elsewhere), miltomate (Mexico, Guatemala), farolito (little lantern), or simply tomate (in which case the tomato is called jitomate from Nahuatl xitomatl).

Shade gardens are a type of garden planted and grown in areas with little or no direct sunlight. Shade gardens may occur naturally or by design under trees, as well as on the side of buildings or fences. Gardening in shaded sites is often seen as more difficult because of limited sunlight, and challenges with drainage, and soil management; these factors limit the kinds of plants that can be cultivated in a shade garden

The evolution of plants has resulted in a wide range of complexity, from the earliest algal mats of unicellular archaeplastids evolved through endosymbiosis, through multicellular marine and freshwater green algae, to spore-bearing terrestrial bryophytes, lycopods and ferns, and eventually to the complex seed-bearing gymnosperms and angiosperms

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(flowering plants) of today. Tomatillo plants prefer full sun exposure The tomatillo (*Physalis philadelphica* and *Physalis ixocarpa*), also known as the Mexican husk tomato, is a plant of the nightshade family bearing small, spherical, and green or green-purple fruit. The tomatillo is a perennial plant, but is generally grown for agriculture each year as if it were an annual. A staple of Mexican cuisine, they are eaten both raw and cooked in a variety of dishes, notably salsa verde. Below 16 °C (61 °F), growth is very poor. Tomatillos originated in Mexico and were cultivated in the pre-Columbian era. They grow best at 25 to 32 °C (77 to 90 °F) dbef144c3

Fruits weigh approximately 8 oz. However, they are highly susceptible to colder environments and are at a higher risk of dying in regions with short growing seasons. The plants can grow. They are resistant to cracking and splitting which usually occurs when there is an excess of water and sugar movement in the fruits. Hillbilly tomato Hillbilly tomato plant stands anywhere from 52"-84" tall when fully established, needing 85-94 days of growth before it reaches its full maturity. It is round, heavily ribbed and its skin and flesh is orange-yellow with red streaks. The fruit is considered a beefsteak tomato weighing 1-2 pounds. Curly top is characterized by stunting of the plant and deformation of leaves and fruit. The petioles and blades of the leaves curl, twist, and become discolored. Plant breeding can be performed using many different techniques, ranging from the selection of the most desirable plants for propagation, to methods that make use of knowledge of genetics and chromosomes, to more complex molecular

== Design == dbe2f144c3 Plants need to be able to grow in shady conditions and handle competition for sunlight. Very few edible plants grow well in shady conditions, so shade gardens are usually ornamental gardens, though growing flowers may also be difficult in shade. Because of these limitations, shade gardening may be seen as less than ideal; however, shade gardens offer opportunities to cultivate plants with diverse foliage that can provide a variety of shades of green and textures, with some shade-plants providing flowers. The plant is a low maintenance crop and does not require extra attention as long as it is planted properly, particularly after any season of frost. It requires full sun with a minimum of six hours daily. This plant also requires water but is drought tolerant, and mulching can help to ensure an even supply of moisture to the tomato plant. There are some problems that may occur with the hillbilly tomato plant which include pests and diseases. You can control some of these problems by crop rotation. dbe2f144c3

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
