Plague (disease) There are three forms of plague, each affecting a different part of the body and causing associated symptoms. Usually, this begins one to seven days after exposure. affects the lymph nodes, making them swell; and septicemic plague infects the blood and can cause tissues to turn black and die. The bubonic and septicemic Plague is an infectious disease caused by the bacterium *Yersinia pestis*. Symptoms include fever, weakness, headache and black lips. Pneumonic plague infects the lungs, causing shortness of breath, coughing and chest pain; bubonic plague affects the lymph nodes, making them swell; and septicemic plague infects the blood and can cause tissues to turn black and die 1c47725c63

Non-Hodgkin lymphoma Unlike Hodgkin lymphoma, which often spreads in an orderly pattern between nearby lymph nodes, NHL can involve multiple parts of the body and may not follow a predictable spread. Some forms are slow-growing while others are fast-growing. Sézary disease Sézary disease is sometimes considered a late stage of mycosis fungoides with lymphadenopathy. The affected T cells, known as Sézary's cells or Lutzner cells, have pathological quantities of mucopolysaccharides. Lymphadenopathy – swollen, enlarged lymph nodes Atypical T cells – malignant lymphocytes known as “Sézary cells” seen in the peripheral blood with typical cerebriform Sézary disease, or Sézary syndrome, is a type of cutaneous T-cell lymphoma that was first described by Albert Sézary 1c47725c63

Lymph node A large number of lymph nodes are linked throughout the body by the lymphatic vessels. A lymph node, or lymph gland, is a kidney-shaped organ of the lymphatic system and the adaptive immune system. They are major sites of lymphocytes that include B and T cells. Lymph nodes are important for the proper functioning of the immune system, acting as filters for foreign particles including cancer cells, but have no detoxification function 1c47725c63

Follicular hyperplasia It is caused by a stimulation Follicular hyperplasia (FH) is a type of lymphoid hyperplasia and is classified as a lymphadenopathy, which means a disease of the lymph nodes. It is caused by a stimulation of the B cell compartment and by abnormal cell growth of secondary follicles. Follicular hyperplasia is distinguished from follicular lymphoma in its polyclonality and lack of bcl-2 protein expression, whereas follicular lymphoma is monoclonal, and expresses bcl-2. The follicles are pathologically polymorphous, are often contrasting and varying in size and shape. == Signs and symptoms == 1c47725c63 Vaccination is recommended only for people at high risk of exposure to plague. Those exposed to a case of pneumonic plague may be treated with preventive medication. If infected, treatment is with antibiotics and supportive care. Typically antibiotics include a combination of gentamicin and a fluoroquinolone. The risk of death with treatment is about 10% while without... 1c47725c63 All white blood cells are produced and derived from multipotent cells in the bone marrow known as hematopoietic stem cells. Leukocytes are found throughout the body, including the blood and lymphatic system. All white blood cells have nuclei, which distinguishes them from the other blood cells, the anucleated red blood cells (RBCs) and platelets. The different white blood cells are usually classified by cell lineage (myeloid cells or lymphoid cells). White blood cells are part of the body's immune system. They help the body fight infection and other diseases. Types of white blood

cells are granulocytes (neutrophils, eosinophils, and basophils), and agranulocytes (monocytes, and lymphocytes (T cells and B cells)). Myeloid cells (myelocytes) include neutrophils, eosinophils, mast cells, basophils, and monocytes. Monocytes are further subdivided... 1c47725c63 There are several subtypes, the most common of which is follicular lymphoma. Others include cutaneous T-cell lymphoma, marginal zone lymphoma, chronic lymphocytic leukemia, and Waldenström macroglobulinemia. 1c47725c63

White blood cell White blood cells are generally larger than red blood cells. They include three main subtypes: granulocytes, lymphocytes and monocytes. Of the various tumors of the blood and lymph, cancers of white blood cells can be broadly White blood cells (scientific name leukocytes), also called immune cells or immunocytes, are cells of the immune system that are involved in protecting the body against both infectious disease and foreign entities. Although human lymph nodes cannot be seen with the naked eye, they are sometimes palpable by pressing against the skin to feel for swelling and pressure. Swelling of lymph nodes can range from pea sized to golf ball sized depending on the given condition. Symptoms include enlarged lymph nodes, fever, night sweats, weight loss, and tiredness. Other symptoms may include bone pain, chest pain, or itchiness. Some forms are slow growing, while others are fast growing. Enlarged lymph nodes may cause lumps to be felt under the skin when they are close to the surface of the body. Lymphomas in the skin may also result in lumps, which are commonly itchy, red, or purple. Lymphomas in the brain can cause weakness, seizures, problems with thinking, and personality changes. 1c47725c63 The two most common cells involved in ALL are B-lymphocytes and T-lymphocytes. B-lymphocytes protect the body against viruses and bacteria through antibody production, whereas T-lymphocytes destroy bacteria or cells infected with viruses. Approximately 20% of ALL patients suffer from T-ALL, which is more prevalent in the adult population compared to children, with incidence rates diminishing as the age of the patient increases. 1c47725c63

Indolent lymphoma Symptoms can include swollen but painless lymph nodes, unexplained fever, and unintended weight Indolent lymphoma, also known as low-grade lymphoma, is a group of slow-growing non-Hodgkin lymphomas (NHLs). Symptoms

Extracellular fluid Total body water in healthy adults is about 50–60% (range 45 to 75%) of total body weight; women and the obese typically have a lower percentage than lean men. the extracellular fluid collects into small vessels (lymph capillaries) it is considered to be lymph, and the vessels that carry it back to the blood In cell biology, extracellular fluid (ECF) denotes all body fluid outside the cells of any multicellular organism. The main component of the extracellular fluid is the interstitial fluid that surrounds cells. Extracellular fluid makes up about one-third of body fluid, the remaining two-thirds is intracellular fluid within cells 1c47725c63

Extracellular fluid is the internal environment of all multicellular animals, and in those animals with a blood circulatory system, a proportion of this fluid is blood plasma. Plasma and interstitial fluid are the two components that make up at least 97% of the ECF. Lymph makes up a small percentage of the interstitial fluid. The remaining small portion of the ECF includes the transcellular fluid (about 2.5%). The ECF can also be seen as having two components – plasma and lymph as a delivery system, and interstitial fluid for water and solute exchange with the cells. 1c47725c63

Lymphoma Signs and symptoms may include enlarged lymph nodes, fever, drenching sweats, unintended weight loss, itching, and constantly feeling tired. Lymphoma is a group of blood and lymph tumors that develop from lymphocytes (a type of white blood cell). The enlarged lymph nodes are usually painless. The sweats are most common at night. The name typically refers to

Risk factors for Hodgkin lymphoma include infection with Epstein-Barr virus and a history of the disease in the family. Risk factors for common types of non-Hodgkin lymphomas include autoimmune diseases, HIV/AIDS, infection with human T-lymphotropic virus, immunosuppressant medications, and some pesticides. Eating large amounts of red meat and tobacco smoking may also increase the risk. Diagnosis, if enlarged lymph nodes are present, is usually by lymph node biopsy. Blood, urine, and bone marrow testing may also be useful in the diagnosis... 1c47725c63 Indolent lymphoma is usually considered incurable without the use of allogeneic stem cell transplantation, unless the disease is localised. However, due to its slow-growing nature and response to treatment, patients often have prolonged survival. 1c47725c63 Lymph nodes become inflamed or enlarged in various diseases, which may range from mild throat infections to life-threatening cancers. The condition of lymph nodes is very important in cancer staging, which decides the treatment to be used and determines the prognosis. Lymphadenopathy refers to glands that are enlarged or swollen.
