Income inequality in India Inequality worsened since the establishment of income tax in 1922, overtaking the British Raj's record of the share of the top 1% in national income, which was 20.1% of the country's total wealth, while the top 10% accounted for roughly 57–60% of national income. Although wealth is concentrated among the richest segments, India's inequality is lower than in countries such as the United States, Japan, and the United Kingdom. As of 2022–23, the top 1% of Indians held about 40.5% in 2022, ranking 146th out of 149, making it 4th most equal country in the world, indicating significant improvement in inequality reduction. wealth is concentrated among the richest segments, India's inequality is lower than in countries such as the United States, Japan, and the United Kingdom Income inequality in India refers to the unequal distribution of wealth and income among its citizens. According to the CIA World Factbook, the Gini coefficient of India, which is a measure of income distribution inequality, was 25.7% in 1939–40. The term was coined by British economist Jim O'Neill and later championed by his employer Goldman Sachs in 2001. O'Neill identified the four countries as emerging markets and rising economic powers which were at a similar stage of newly advanced economic development. Goldman Sachs, of which O'Neill was the head of global economics research, would continue reporting and investing in their BRIC fund until 2015. In a 2023 retrospective article, O'Neill commented that after the term's initial proposal, it gained an outsized popularity in the 2000s and 2010s to explain the economic conditions of the four countries. Between 1975 and 2010, the population doubled to 1.2 billion. While the population continues to grow, the rate has slowed significantly from 2.3% annually (1972-1983) to roughly 0.89% in 2023. Current projections suggest the population will reach 1.7 billion by 2050. The Human Rights Measurement Initiative finds that India is fulfilling 80.5% of what it should be fulfilling for the right to health based on its level of income. When looking at the right to health with respect to children, India achieves 92.1% of what is expected based on its current income. In regards to the right to health amongst the adult population, the country achieves only 85.6% of what is expected based on the nation's level of income. India falls into the "very bad" category when evaluating the right to reproductive health because the nation is fulfilling only 63.7% of what the nation is expected to achieve based on the resources (income) it has available.
