

# The Sickness By Disturbed

Disturbed's debut album, *The Sickness*, was released in 2000 as a commercial success, mainly due to the singles "Down With the Sickness" and "Stupify". The band then released the albums *Believe* (2002), *Ten Thousand Fists* (2005), *Indestructible* (2008), and *Asylum* (2010), all of which debuted at No. 1 on the Billboard 200 chart. Disturbed went into hiatus in October 2011, during which the band's members focused on various side projects, and released *The Lost Children*, a compilation album containing previously unreleased songs. They returned in June 2015 and released their sixth album *Immortalized* that same year. They followed it up with the albums *Evolution* (2018) and *Divisive* (2022). *The Sickness* was Disturbed's first studio release since the band's formation in 1994. Reflecting on the band's early days, lead vocalist David Draiman said in a 2015 interview, "People think it was like this meteoric rise. It really wasn't. We beat the hell out of ourselves for two or three years as a local band, our own self-promotional mega-machine, every band member in a different venue of the city every time a rock show would come through town, passing out our promotional material — cassettes, stickers, t-shirts, whatever we could. [This was] in addition to playing strategically where we thought it made sense... With Black Sabbath's August 2001 tour canceled, and Disturbed's opening slot with it, the Chicago quartet planned to use the month following Ozzfest to begin pre-production of their next album while preparing for their own headlining tour. Most of the lyrical content was inspired by aspects of frontman David Draiman's life prior to making the album. The album is meant to take a fresh direction in the band's music career, while remaining consistent with the band's previous albums. Disturbed discography The album reached the top 30 on the United States' Billboard 200, and the Australian ARIA Charts. Since its release, *The Sickness* was certified 5× platinum, a measure of its high sales volume, in the US by the Recording Industry Association of America (RIAA), 3× platinum in Canada by Music Canada, platinum in both Australia by the Australian Recording Industry Association (ARIA) and New Zealand by Recorded Music NZ (RMNZ), and gold in the United Kingdom by the British Phonographic Industry (BPI). Indestructible (Disturbed album) A self-produced effort, Indestructible is the first Disturbed album that did not feature Johnny K, the producer of Disturbed's previous three albums, The Sickness, Believe, and Ten Thousand Fists. Asylum debuted at number one on the Billboard 200 chart with sales of approximately 179,000 according to Nielsen Soundscan. This is the fourth consecutive number one album in the U.S. for Disturbed. The other two bands ever to accomplish this feat in the Soundscan era are metal band Metallica and folk rock/jam band Dave Matthews Band. Some of the lyrical themes involve actual experiences that vocalist David Draiman had endured over the course of the past few years prior to making the album, including "bad relationships", a motorcycle accident that he was involved with, and an incident of suicide. To match the aggressive attitude and nature of said themes, Draiman told the other band members to create darker, more textural music than they have before. Down with the Sickness "Down with the Sickness" is a song by American heavy metal band Disturbed.
