

Tick Bite Disease Symptoms In Humans

Tick bite fever is caused by the bacterium *Rickettsia africae*. The bacterium is spread by ticks of the *Amblyomma* type. These generally live in tall grass or bush rather than in cities. The diagnosis is typically based on symptoms. It can be confirmed by culture, PCR, or immunofluorescence.

Tick-borne infections in humans, farm animals, and companion animals are primarily associated with wildlife animal reservoirs. Many tick-borne infections in humans involve a complex cycle between wildlife animal reservoirs and tick vectors. The survival and transmission of these tick-borne viruses are closely linked to their interactions with tick vectors and host cells. These viruses are classified into different families, including Asfarviridae, Reoviridae, Rhabdoviridae, Orthomyxoviridae, Bunyaviridae, and Flaviviridae.

Many invertebrates are responsible for transmitting diseases. Mosquitoes are perhaps the best known invertebrate vector and transmit a wide range of tropical diseases including malaria, dengue fever and yellow fever. Another large group of vectors are flies. Sandfly species transmit the disease leishmaniasis, by acting as vectors for protozoan *Leishmania* species, and tsetse flies transmit protozoan trypanosomes (*Trypanosoma brucei gambiense* and *Trypanosoma brucei rhodesiense*) which cause African Trypanosomiasis (sleeping sickness). Ticks and lice form another large group of invertebrate vectors. The bacterium *Borrelia burgdorferi*, which causes Lyme Disease, is transmitted by ticks and members of the bacterial genus *Rickettsia* are transmitted by lice. The symptoms of the disease include a high fever with frontal headaches, chills, severe muscle pain, vomiting, and other gastrointestinal symptoms. Bleeding problems may occur 3–4 days after initial symptom onset. Patients may experience abnormally low blood pressure, and low platelet, red blood cell, and white blood cell counts. After 1–2 weeks of symptoms, some patients recover without complications. However, the illness is biphasic for a subset of patients (10–20%) who experience a second wave of symptoms at the beginning of the third week. These symptoms include fever and signs of neurological manifestations, such as severe headache, mental disturbances, tremors, and vision deficits. The convalescent period is typically very long, lasting several months. Muscle aches and weakness also occur during this period, and the patient is unable to engage... 9a47ba223d Though *D. variabilis* may be exposed to *Borrelia burgdorferi*, the causative agent of Lyme disease, these ticks are not competent vectors for the transmission of this disease. The primary vectors for *B. burgdorferi* are the deer ticks *Ixodes scapularis* in eastern parts of the United States, *Ixodes pacificus* in California and Oregon, and *Ixodes ricinus* in Europe. *D. variabilis* may also carry *Anaplasma phagocytophilum*, the causative agent of human granulocytic anaplasmosis, and *Ehrlichia chaffeensis*, the causative agent of human monocytic ehrlichiosis. 9a47ba223d There are two main categories of tick: soft ticks (family Argasidae) and hard ticks (family Ixodidae).

A third tick family, Nuttalliellidae, is less commonly discussed. The primary distinction between soft and hard ticks is the amount of time they stay attached to their host. Soft ticks remain attached on the order of a couple of hours and may take multiple blood meals from the same host. Hard ticks, on the other hand, tend to stay attached for several days to weeks, feeding continuously. If untreated, symptoms may include loss of the ability to move one or both sides of the face, joint pains, severe headaches with neck stiffness or heart palpitations. Months to years later, repeated episodes of joint pain and swelling may occur.
