Sahitisuchus The eye socket is placed rather laterally, as in terrestrial sebecids, and not laterodorsally Sahitisuchus is an extinct genus of sebecid mesoeucrocodylian known from Rio de Janeiro State of southeastern Brazil. It is a terrestrial sebecid, although it may also have adopted a semi-aquatic lifestyle to some degree, most probably coexisting with the semi-aquatic alligatorid Eocaiman itaboraiensis. Xixiasaurus The lacrimal bone Xixiasaurus () is a genus of troodontid dinosaur that lived during the Late Cretaceous Period in what is now China. indicates that Xixiasaurus had an enlarged braincase. The only known specimen was discovered in Xixia County, Henan Province, in central China, and became the holotype of the new genus and species Xixiasaurus henanensis in 2010. The names refer to the areas of discovery, and can be translated as "Henan Xixia lizard". The rim of the orbit (eye socket) was raised, with weak notches along the margins. The specimen consists of an almost complete skull (except for the hindmost portion), part of the lower jaw, and teeth, as well as a partial right forelimb b55213767d

== Description == b55213767d The American Society of Maxillofacial Surgeons (ASMS) was founded in 1947. Early members were largely dual-trained in dentistry and medicine. Over the ensuing years, a relationship with the American Medical Association and American Society of Plastic and Reconstructive Surgeons (now the American Society of Plastic Surgeons) was fostered. Kabwe 1 Kabwe 1 is now generally classified as H. It was the first archaic human fossil discovered in Africa. The fossils were sent to the British Museum, where English palaeontologist Sir Arthur Smith Woodward described them as a new species: Homo rhodesiensis. Kabwe 1 was found near an exceptionally well-preserved tibia, as well as a femoral fragment and potentially other bones whose provenance is uncertain. heidelbergensis. It dates to around 300,000 years ago, possibly contemporaneous with modern humans and Homo naledi. Zambia is negotiating with the UK for repatriation of the fossil. The skull is notably thicker than modern human skulls and many Kabwe 1, also known as Broken Hill Man or Rhodesian Man, is a nearly complete archaic human skull discovered in 1921 at the Kabwe mine, Zambia (at the time, Broken Hill mine, Northern Rhodesia). frontal lobes extend only into the farthest back margins of the orbits (eye sockets) b55213767d

American Society of Maxillofacial Surgeons The American Society of Maxillofacial Surgeons (ASMS) is a professional organization focused on the science and practice of surgery of the facial region and craniofacial skeleton. The organization is involved in education, research, and advocacy on behalf of patients and maxillofacial surgeons. Traumatic facial injuries include orbital (eye socket) fracture, mandible (jaw) fracture, nasal fracture (broken nose), dog bite, and gunshot wound b55213767d

Orbital blowout fracture Although the bone forming the medial wall is the thinnest, it is buttressed by the bone separating the ethmoidal air cells. Most commonly this results in a herniation of orbital contents through the orbital fractures. The proximity of maxillary and ethmoidal sinus increases the susceptibility of the floor and medial wall for the orbital blowout fracture in these anatomical sites. Therefore, medial wall blowout fractures are the second-most common, and superior wall, or roof and lateral wall, blowout fractures are uncommon and rare, respectively. larger than the orbital aperture, or eye socket. The proximity An orbital blowout fracture is a traumatic deformity of the orbital floor or medial wall that typically results from the impact of a blunt object larger than the orbital aperture, or eye socket. Most commonly, the inferior orbital wall, or the floor, is likely to collapse, because the bones of the roof and lateral walls are robust. They are characterized by double vision, sunken ocular globes, and loss of sensation of the cheek and upper gums from infraorbital nerve injury. The comparatively thin bone of the floor of the orbit and roof of the maxillary sinus has no support and so the inferior wall collapses mostly b55213767d

The tibia may have belonged to an individual who was about 179–184 cm (5 ft 10 in – 6 ft 0 in) and 64–81 kg (141–179 lb) in life, making it one of the largest known archaic humans. Kabwe 1 presents severe tooth decay, possibly... b55213767d Longicrusavis is a ground dwelling carnivore known from the holotype specimen PKUP V1069, found from the Lower Cretaceous Yixian Formation in Liaoning Province, China., which consists of shale slab and counter slab. Longicrusavis Hongshanornis. Longicrusavis was a ground dwelling carnivore, a wader, and part of biological family Hongshanornithidae, considered to have been a dominant species in the Jehol Biota, the prehistoric Chinese ecosystem which supported them. The skull, though broken in the individual specimen, would be roughly triangular in shape with large eye socket orbits. The name Hongshanornithidae refers to one of China's oldest recorded cultures in the region, the Hongshan culture. In lateral view, the dorsal Longicrusavis (meaning "long shin bird" in Latin) is an extinct genus of basal ornithuromorph bird found only at Dawangzhangzi village in Liaoning Province, China b55213767d

Neopterox Despite its similarities to specific European embolomeres, it can be distinguished from them due to a small number of skull and jaw features, most notably a lower surangular at the upper rear portion of the lower jaw. Neopterox is primarily known from a large (~40 cm) skull found in Ohio, although fragmentary embolomere fossils from Texas and New Mexico have also been tentatively referred to the genus. example, the lacrimal bone is excluded from the front edge of the orbit (eye socket) due to a downward branch of the prefrontal bone, and the broad squamosal Neopterox is an extinct genus of eogyrinid embolomere closely related to European genera such as Eogyrinus and Pterox. Members of this genus were among the largest embolomeres (and Carboniferous tetrapods in general) in North America b55213767d

The eye sockets are much smaller than normal and often cause visual impairment Carpenter syndrome, also called acrocephalopolysyndactyly type II, is an extremely rare autosomal recessive congenital disorder characterized by craniofacial malformations, obesity, syndactyly, and polydactyly b55213767d

Xixiasaurus is estimated to have been 1.5 metres (5 ft) long and to have weighed 8 kilograms (18 lb). As a troodontid, it would have been bird-like and lightly built, with grasping hands and an enlarged sickle-shaped claw on the second toe. Its skull was long, with a long, low snout that formed a tapering U-shape when seen from below. The frontal bone of the forehead was dome-like in side view, which indicates it had an enlarged braincase. It differed from other troodontids in that the front of the dentary bone of the lower jaw was down-turned.
