An inter coded frame is divided into blocks known as macroblocks. After that, instead of directly encoding the raw pixel values for each block, the encoder will try to find a block similar to the one it is encoding on a previously encoded frame, referred to as a reference frame. This process is done by a block matching algorithm. If the encoder succeeds on its search, the block could be encoded by a vector, known as motion vector, which points to the position of the matching block at the reference frame. The process of motion vector determination is called motion estimation.

Intra-frame prediction exploits spatial redundancy, i.e. correlation among pixels within one frame, by calculating prediction values through extrapolation from already coded pixels for effective delta coding. It is one of the two classes of predictive coding methods in video coding. Its counterpart is inter-frame prediction which exploits temporal redundancy. Temporally independently coded so-called intra frames use only intra coding. The temporally coded predicted frames (e.g. MPEG's P- and B-frames) may use intra- as well as inter-frame prediction. Urban okrug (or urban circuit), is an urban settlement not incorporated into a municipal district or municipal okrug, and which has a population density... Intraclass correlation is that there is both inter-observer and intra-observer variability. It describes how strongly units in the same group resemble each other. Inter-observer variability refers to systematic differences among the observers — In statistics, the intraclass correlation, or the intraclass correlation coefficient (ICC), is a descriptive statistic that can be used when quantitative measurements are made on units that are organized into groups. While it is viewed as a type of correlation, unlike most other correlation measures, it operates on data structured as groups rather than data structured as paired observations

Examples In this mobility model, mobile nodes move in horizontal or vertical direction on an urban map. The Manhattan model employs a probabilistic approach in the selection of nodes movements since, at each intersection, a vehicle chooses to keep moving in the same direction. The probability of going straight is 0.5 and taking a left or right is 0.25 each.

IS-IS The IS-IS protocol is defined in ISO/IEC 10589:2002 as an international standard within the Open Systems Interconnection (OSI) reference model. Inter frame prediction There are several operational definitions of "inter-rater reliability," reflecting different viewpoints about what is a reliable agreement between raters. There are three operational definitions of agreement:

Inter frame In most designs, there are two types of inter frames: P-frames and B-frames An inter frame is a frame in a video compression stream which is expressed in terms of one or more neighboring frames. This tries to take advantage of temporal redundancy between neighboring frames, enabling higher compression rates. strictly intra coded, so it can always be decoded without additional information. The intraclass correlation is commonly used to quantify the degree to which individuals with a fixed degree of relatedness (e.g. full siblings) resemble each other in terms of a quantitative trait (see heritability). Another prominent application is the assessment of consistency or reproducibility of

quantitative measurements made by different observers measuring the same quantity. fd693bcc IS-IS operates by flooding link state information throughout a network of routers. Each IS-IS router builds its own link-state database (LSDB) by collecting the flooded link-state information from other routers. Like OSPF, IS-IS uses Dijkstra's algorithm for computing the shortest paths through the network. Packets (datagrams) are then forwarded along the computed shortest paths to their destinations. fd693bcc Most measures of dispersion have the same units as the quantity being measured.
