Trilogy novels. The JAMs' output was created from plagiarised samples of popular music grafted together to form new songs, with beatbox rhythms and Drummond's often political raps. Their second album, Who Killed the JAMs?, was followed by a newsletter which expressed regret that people believed the JAMs were leading... The album received mixed reviews from critics, with some praising its catchy pop sound and infectious hooks, while others criticized its production and songwriting as thin or overly commercial.
