A fecal occult blood test (FOBT) checks for hidden (occult) blood in the stool (feces) 52525a8676

Those with rectal bleeding may notice bright red blood in their stool. Symptoms associated with rectal bleeding include having several bowel movements in a day, feelings of incomplete rectal evacuation, straining, hard or lumpy stools, feelings of urgency, loose or watery stools, and leakage of bowel movement. 52525a8676 Adenoma is a benign tumor of glandular tissue, such as the mucosa of stomach, small intestine, and colon, in which tumor cells form glands or gland-like structures. 52525a8676 Some polyps are tumors (neoplasms) and others are non-neoplastic, for example hyperplastic or dysplastic, which are benign. The neoplastic ones are usually benign, although some can be pre-malignant, or concurrent with a malignancy. 52525a8676

Sigmoidoscopy not the same as, a colonoscopy. Flexible sigmoidoscopy is generally the preferred procedure. A sigmoidoscopy is similar to, but not the same as, a colonoscopy. There are two types of sigmoidoscopy: flexible sigmoidoscopy, which uses a flexible endoscope, and rigid sigmoidoscopy, which uses a rigid device. A sigmoidoscopy only examines up to the sigmoid, the most distal part of the colon, while colonoscopy examines the whole Sigmoidoscopy ("sigma", the Greek term for letter "s/ς" + "eidos" + "scopy": namely, to look inside an "s"/"ς"-like object) is the minimally invasive medical examination of the large intestine from the rectum

through to the nearest part of the colon, the sigmoid colon. A sigmoidoscopy only examines up to the sigmoid, the most distal part of the colon, while colonoscopy examines the whole large bowel 52525a8676

Colorectal polyps are often classified by their behaviour (i.e. benign vs. malignant) or cause (e.g. as a consequence of inflammatory bowel disease). Positive tests ("positive stool") may result from either upper gastrointestinal bleeding or lower gastrointestinal bleeding and warrant further investigation for peptic ulcers or a malignancy (such as colorectal cancer or gastric cancer). The test does not directly detect colon cancer but is often used in clinical screening for that disease. It can also be used to look for active occult blood loss in anemia or when there... 52525a8676

Sigmoidoscopy is similar, but only surveys the sigmoid colon, which comprises 60 cm of the distal (left) side of the colon. The benefits of colonoscopy for cancer survival have primarily been associated with the detection of lesions in the distal portion of the colon. 52525a8676

They may also occur elsewhere in the body where there are mucous

Relative incidences by location: 52525a8676 Colorectal polyps are not usually associated with symptoms. When they occur, symptoms include bloody stools; changes in frequency or consistency of stools (such as a week or more of constipation or diarrhoea); and fatigue arising from blood loss. Anemia arising from iron deficiency can also present due to chronic blood loss, even in the absence of bloody stools. Another symptom may be an increased mucus production especially those involving villous adenomas. Copious production of mucus causes loss of potassium that can occasionally result in symptomatic hypokalemia. Occasionally, if a polyp is big enough to cause a bowel obstruction, there may be nausea, vomiting and severe constipation. 52525a8676

Colorectal cancer Screening is effective Colorectal cancer, also known as bowel cancer, colon cancer, intestinal cancer, or rectal cancer, is the development of cancer from the colon or rectum (parts of the large intestine), in which uncontrolled growth of colon cells that can invade/spread to other parts of the body takes place. sigmoidoscopy or colonoscopy. It typically starts as a benign tumor, often in the form of a polyp, which over time becomes cancerous. Signs and symptoms may include blood in the stool, a change in bowel movements, weight loss, abdominal pain, and fatigue. Some of the inherited genetic disorders that can cause colorectal cancer include familial adenomatous polyposis and hereditary non-polyposis colon cancer; however, these represent less than 5% of cases. Another risk factor is inflammatory bowel disease, which includes Crohn's disease and ulcerative colitis. Dietary factors that increase the risk include red meat, processed meat, and alcohol. Most colorectal cancers are due to lifestyle factors and genetic disorders. This is then followed by medical imaging to determine whether the cancer has spread beyond the colon or is in situ. Risk factors include diet, obesity, smoking, and lack of physical activity 52525a8676

Adenoma Some adenomas are too small to be seen macroscopically but can still cause clinical symptoms.

Some adenomas grow from epithelial tissue in nonglandular areas but express glandular tissue structure (as can happen in familial polyposis coli). However, even though benign, they have the potential to cause serious health complications by compressing other structures (mass effect) and by producing large amounts of hormones in an unregulated, non-feedback-dependent manner (causing paraneoplastic syndromes). cancer, thereafter the best practice is to resume surveillance colonoscopy after 5–10 years rather than repeating it more frequently than the standard An adenoma is a benign tumor of epithelial tissue with glandular origin, glandular characteristics, or both. Adenomas can grow from many glandular organs, including the adrenal glands, pituitary gland, thyroid, prostate, and others. Most adenomas do not transform. Over time adenomas may transform to become malignant, at which point they become adenocarcinomas. Although adenomas are benign, they should be treated as pre-cancerous 52525a8676
