"Love Yourself" was nominated for two Grammy Awards: Song of the Year and Best Pop Solo Performance. It was the seventh-best-selling song of 2016 in the US.

== Structure == "Can't Tell Me Nothing" received universal acclaim from music critics, who mostly appreciated the lyrical content.
