Following Brexit, EU law and the Court of Justice of the European Union no longer have primacy over British law, but the UK remains bound by obligations in treaties it has with other countries around the world, including many with EU member states and with the EU itself. The European Union (Withdrawal) Act 2018 retains relevant EU law as domestic law, which the UK can amend or repeal. 1995 enlargement of the European Union membership of the EU and the EU agreed to enter negotiations. Switzerland also applied for membership on 26 May 1992, but withdrew it after a negative referendum result on 6 December 1992 (and that was not changed after a second negative referendum result on 4 March 2001). All these states were previous members of the European Free Trade Association (EFTA) and had traditionally been less interested in joining the EU than other European countries. The EU's change of heart was also due to predicted enlargement of the EU towards countries The 1995 enlargement of the European Union saw Austria, Finland, and Sweden accede to the European Union (EU). It is also known as the EFTA Enlargement round. This was the EU's fourth enlargement and came into effect on 1 January of that year. From 31 January to 31 December 2020, the UK was in a transition period, and continued to contribute to the EU as if it were a member until the end of the transition period, reducing the amount of the financial settlement. From December 2020, the payments accrue twice a year. By 31 December 2023, the UK had paid a net amount of £23.8 billion, leaving an estimated £6.4 billion outstanding. A further £2.4 billion was due to have been paid by May 2024 with the remaining £4.0 billion being payable up until 2065. ff3e0e110c
